Minister's Article

Neighborhood Prayer Group Update

At the end of January, I invited the congregation to pray for our neighborhood (meaning: all the houses and properties that are adjacent to the block on which we are located). I specifically asked you to keep the neighborhood in your prayers until Easter. You might recall that I included in the newsletter dated the week of 1/29 a sample prayer everyone could either recite or adapt in their own prayer time. If you have been doing this for the past six weeks, I would love to know how you have experienced that practice. Feel free to reach out and share with me what you've learned through that process (mkarunas@cccdisciples.org).

Every Monday afternoon since the end of January, from 5-6 p.m., Pastor Vicky and I have been meeting in the Disciples Room with anyone who has wanted to pray for the neighborhood with us. We have dedicated that hour to talking about, thinking about, and praying for our neighbors as a small group. As Easter is fast approaching, I wanted to use this space here to give an update on what has been emerging from that group.

First off, there has been a different group of people gathering each time. A total of 10 people have attended, some coming once and others attending nearly every session. We follow the same format each week. There are four (4) rounds.

- 1 Where did you hear God speak to you during this past week? What did you hear?
- 2 What is on your mind as you think about the neighborhood this week?
- 3 What would you like to ask God for as it relates to our neighborhood?
- 4 Pray for neighborhood



The rounds that generated the most discussion were numbers 2 and 3. Here are some of the highlights from the group discussion around those questions: What is on your mind as you think about our neighborhood?

- Just thinking about the neighborhood can be daunting
- How can we be supportive of families and their children?
- Litter: Everyone feels better when there is less of it:
 - We could clean up litter on neighboring properties as well as our own
- Get to know the houses / buildings "personally" (and the people who live in them)
- People in our neighborhood might represent anger, mental illness, hurts, etc....
 - We have a responsibility to be more involved
- We could make connections with other churches in our wider neighborhood:
 - New Church Science neighbors (on Prairie)
 - Ebeneezer church (our own building two blocks down William)

- Maybe we could buy properties in the neighborhood as they come for sale and partner with Habitat for Humanity to rehab them
- We might have resources to offer. Examples:
 - "handyman" skills to help with small home repairs and projects
 - Transportation (doctor / shopping)
- Education for CCC members:
 - Without getting into policies, help educate our people as to what it's like to live on a fixed income as a payee etc....
- We want to see that we are "in this together":
 - Truly get to know others so that we might receive from them as much as they receive from us
- We want to see our neighbors as "whole people" and not just candidates to receive some "help" that we can offer
- We want to remember that some people we encounter in our neighborhood are really "interlopers" (passing through) our neighborhood
- We could open the church to be a cooling (summer) / warming station (in the winter months)
- We could offer the opportunity to cash checks for free

What would you like to ask God for as it relates to our neighborhood?

- Give us courage to be open, humble and to follow through
- Give us a different set of eyes (perspective to see things differently)
- Show us our purpose (why we are here)
- Show us who our partners are (both inside / outside building)
- Keep us hopeful! Expecting big things!
- Give us focus (show us the particular pathway of involvement best suited for us)
- Pray for patience (not to give up if "results" aren't immediate)
- Give us strength to be non-anxious
