### **Educational Opportunity – Overview of the New Testament**

For six (6) weeks from the end of May through the end of June, I will offer a class entitled, <u>Overview of the New Testament</u>. The class will meet on **Thursdays from 5:00 – 6:15 p.m.** and will run from **May 23 through June 27**. All are welcome! We will look at such things as:

- The political and economic world in which Jesus' ministry took place
- What the religious world was like in which Paul spread his message.
- How each of the 4 Gospels represents a distinct point of view
- And so much more!

This will not be a "bible study" class in the traditional sense that we take a deep-dive into passage after passage. Rather, we will highlight and read many different scriptures throughout the New Testament as examples of the subject matter we'll be learning. ### Did You Know...

Did You Know... that the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has always promoted a spirit of cooperation with other Christians?

Undoubtedly the most important moment in our church's history – and one that even stands out as an integral one in the history of the United States – occurred in early August 1801. At that time, Barton Stone was serving as pastor of three very small, rural Presbyterian congregations in Kentucky. At that time, Presbyterians would celebrate communion four times per year. One of those times was in the summer – after the planting was done and before the fall harvest. Beginning in the late 1700s, Presbyterian congregations in Kentucky would gather together for the summer communion celebration. Several congregations would agree to meet at a particular church for worship and the sharing of the Lord's Supper together.

By 1801 this had turned into a multi-day affair. People would gather on Thursday, when they would set up their wagons and tents for the weekend. On Thursday and Friday there would be preaching (on the importance of the Christian faith and the ritual of communion). On Saturday everyone would sign their name to the Westminster Confession, which confirmed that one believed in the teachings of the Presbyterian church and was required in order to receive communion the next day. Finally, on Sunday, (continued on page 3...)

they would worship together and partake of communion. All this happened outside – as no congregational meeting house could hold that many people. But the people would sit in orderly make-shift rows and then come up in groups to partake of the bread and cup.


In August 1801, Barton Stone's congregation in Cane Ridge, KY was chosen as the site of the summer communion weekend. But something extraordinary happened. Estimates claim that as many as 30,000 people showed up and not all were Presbyterians. Methodist, Baptists, Lutherans and Episcopalians were also there. For two days different preachers from all denominations would take turns standing on tree stumps and preaching to the crowds, many at the same time (the crowds were so big). Stone claimed that the Holy Spirit rained over all the crowd, as people were "falling out" and testifying everywhere — often taking their place on a tree stump offering a witness to their faith moments after they had been convicted. For three days this happened and on Sunday, when it was time for communion to be served, Stone felt it irresponsible that only the Presbyterians receive the bread and cup. If the Holy Spirit of God could fall on all those who had gathered, Stone reasoned, how could he - a simple, human pastor — prevent them from receiving the bread and cup of salvation? Stone figured he could not do this, and made sure all were served that day.

That event would become the beginnings of what is known as the Second Great Awakening in the United States. Shortly thereafter, Stone (and others) would leave the Presbyterian Church to begin what would become the Christian-Disciples movement. And to this day, we (in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)), consider ourselves to be "Christians only, but not the only Christians." We believe that what unites us is far more important than what divides us. In any community where there is a Disciples of Christ congregation, chances are it readily works together with other churches to promote camaraderie among Christians and participates fully in local ministerial alliances and mission projects.
