Minister's Article

The Importance of Listening in Building Community

(What follows is an excerpt from the information Pastor Melinda shared with those who took her 3-week small group, "Life Together." This excerpt comes from "Listening as a Spiritual Practice" by a colleague and friend of Pastor Melinda)

Kay Lindahl from the Global Listening Center speaks of "spiritual listening as being at the heart of relationships." When we offer spiritual listening, we provide a container for that other person to pour out their genuine selves. We listen without judgment and without thinking about what we may want to say. We are intentional and focused on the other person's thoughts, feelings, and words. This attention is a product of listening to God and hearing what God has to say to us.

Henri Nouwen speaks of spiritual listening as hospitality. "Listening is much more than allowing another to talk while waiting for a chance to respond. Listening is paying full attention to others and welcoming them into our very beings. The beauty of listening goes beyond just hearing words and allows those who are listened to, to start feeling accepted; start taking their words more seriously; and discovering their true selves. Listening is a form of spiritual hospitality by which you invite strangers to become friends, to get to know their inner selves more fully, and even to dare to be silent with you."

Marjorie Thompson speaks of this kind of listening as starting with spiritual listening to God as we receive the gift of grace. She says "until we are deeply rooted in the experience of God's grace, we have neither the living example nor the strength of commitment to live hospitably in a hostile world. Whatever form our hospitality may take, it is already a response to God." We receive what God offers to us, and then give it to others - friends or strangers. Thompson says "our love for one another is a direct expression of our love for God." We see in others a sister or brother. She goes on to remind us that "if we cannot truly accept our weaknesses as well as our gifts, we will be unable to love others in their brokenness and giftedness."

Finally, an extract from Pope Francis on the 50th World Communication Day (2016):

"Listening is much more than simply hearing. Hearing is about receiving information, while listening is about communication, and calls for closeness. Listening allows us not simply to be passive onlookers, users or consumers. Listening also means being able to share questions and doubts, to journey side by side and to put our abilities and gifts at the service of the common good. Listening involves a sort of martyrdom or self-sacrifice, as we try to imitate Moses before the burning bush: we must remove our sandals when standing on the 'holy ground' of our encounter with the one who speaks to me. Knowing how to listen is an immense grace. It is a gift which we need to ask for and then make every effort to practice."


