Minister's Article

Repentance: The Change in Ourselves

Before we can ask God to change the world, we must be prepared to ask God to change us.

I wish I could take credit for that saying. I saw it posted on Facebook recently and believe it came from Richard Rohr. Or perhaps I just imagined it coming from Richard Rohr, someone whose writing and theological perspective I have greatly appreciated over the years. Regardless of its source, the content is what is most compelling. So often in our world today, we want to others to change. We want others to be like us before we give them our time, energy and the benefit of our doubt. We want them to accommodate our vision for the world before we accept them, respect them and dignify them. Sometimes, our faith become wrapped up in this desire that others change.

Recently, I had a phone conversation with someone who was having a hard time talking with people in her life about faith. It seems that when they talk about God, they use different names for God. She admitted to feeling more comfortable if these others would use the same language for God she did. She asked me – as we have some of the same friends – if the same thing bothered me. I responded that it didn't bother me, as there are many names for God used in scripture and that God is bigger than even the best of the names we can come up with when speaking about God; that the names we use for God are more for us than they are for God; that they are offered to us as ways each of us might access and connect with God.

The truth is, Jesus asks *us* to change first before insisting on the change of others. Jesus' first words of proclamation were to "Repent, for the kingdom of God is near!" (MK 1:15, MT 4:17). And even before Jesus appeared on the scene, John the Baptist proclaimed a "baptism of repentance" in order to be prepared to receive the Christ who was coming (LK 3:7-14). Repentance is a bit of strange word in the bible, but it is essentially about change. It is changing something about the way we *think*; how we think about ourselves; how we think about God. And it has something to do with how *act* toward one another. But at its core, it has to do with changing; changing something about the way we think and something about the way we act. Moreover, the focus is on *us*; ourselves. The issue is not "Does everyone need to change." The answer to that question is, "Yes, of course." The issue is "What is Christ wanting to change about *me*; about the way *I* think about myself and God; the way *I* act toward those around me." In the respect, there is no need to focus on others "out there" because there is enough for me to focus on the person "in here."

A few weeks ago, I shared the acronym AAA during worship. Borrowed from the world of 12-step recovery, this stands for Awareness, Acceptance and Action. Awareness is the recognition that "I have a issue to address." Acceptance is, "I accept that I have an issue to face." Action is doing something to change the issue. When I think of this pattern, I see a connection to the essence of repentance. Repentance is about focusing on ourselves and asking "What are the issues within me that Jesus wants to change so that I may experience the Kingdom Jesus comes to bring? What is it about me that Jesus wants me to accept needs to change?"

Repentance is about a change that always begins with each of us, before it has anything to do with anyone around us. I believe that this is what Jesus means when he says "Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye?" (MT 7:3). Before any of us can truly receive God's grace, repentance is a necessary step we must take. Only when we are able to receive God's grace can we hope to extend it to others. The season of Lent, which we have now begun, is an appropriate time to consider the importance of repentance to our spiritual growth.
