A LETTER FROM PASTOR PAM

Welcome, 2024! What an opportunity each new year presents as we anticipate the coming days full of potential and grace! Many of us have made New Year's resolutions to form new habits and attain our newly-created goals. We have just come from the holidays and are eternally optimistic about our potential. However, life returns to normal much quicker than anticipated as children return to school, demands at work increase, and unhealthy habits have a resiliency to hold on. We feel alone in our inability. Alas, we are human.

Do not lose hope! We are not alone. In 1735, the British hymn-writer Robert Robinson was born into a working-class family. Robert's mother sent him away to study as a barber's apprentice in his youth. Not interested in this profession, Robert fell in with a notorious gang of hooligans. His debauched lifestyle found transformation under the preaching of George Whitfield. Shortly after giving his life to Christ, Robinson went on to pastor several churches in England.

In 1758, Robinson wrote "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing," which many have interpreted as an autobiographical composition sharing the depth of his transformation from sin to salvation and his utter reliance upon God.

Throughout Lent, we will be using "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" as our guide in worship to a deeper, more profound experience of God's grace given to humankind so that we might flourish in our daily lives of prayer and connection with God.


"Come, thou fount of every blessing, tune my heart to sing thy grace; streams of mercy never ceasing, calls for songs of loudest praise.




