What follows Easter?

Do we simply put away our Easter decorations and get on with our summer plans? In the church, we talk a great deal about the 40 days of Lent, but did you know there are 50 days of Eastertide?

Eastertide is the season between the religious celebrations of Easter and Pentecost, where we are invited to embrace the miraculous works of God. As Easter people, we recognize the mystery and wonder of Jesus' bodily resurrection from the tomb, not just on one Sunday each year for every Sunday since the first Easter is a resurrection celebration.


