
The 2024 Youth Mission Trip is to to Mexico, MO from July 21-27. Interested youth must have their deposit paid by the end of November to secure their spot.

FINANCE UPDATE



This year, the staff has worked diligently on cutting costs by reviewing and negotiating contracts, switching vendors when needed, and researching potential grant money for which we may be eligible. This effort has resulted in the following savings:

CLEANING *\$11,880*

ASBURY HALL GRANT \$4,500

COPYING/PRINTING \$4,200

DOOR MATS \$2,160

FACILITIES SUPPLIES \$2,069

PHONE/INTERNET \$1,200

LANDSCAPING \$1,000



To summarize, the good news is that with a staff that works part-time, with the exception of our full-time pastor, and the above cost-savings measures, we have managed to keep our expenses low. The bad news is that costs continue to rise everywhere, especially the utilities. Please take a look at your promised pledge for 2023 and catch-up if needed.

Looking toward 2024, as of late October 2023 (end of the third quarter), we had received only 1/3 of the pledge cards expected. We use these cards to create the budget, so please send them in so that the Leadership Board can accurately forecast next year's budget.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES








