

**Matthew 3:16–17 (ESV)** <sup>16</sup> And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; <sup>17</sup> and behold, a voice from heaven said, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.”

**Ephesians 3:18–19 (NLT)** <sup>18</sup> And may you have the power to understand, as all God’s people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep his love is. <sup>19</sup> May you experience the love of Christ, though it is too great to understand fully. Then you will be made complete with all the fullness of life and power that comes from God.

**Romans 5:8 (CSB)** But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

**Romans 8:35–39 (NLT)** <sup>35</sup> Can anything ever separate us from Christ’s love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death? <sup>36</sup> (As the Scriptures say, “For your sake we are killed every day; we are being slaughtered like sheep.”) <sup>37</sup> No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us. <sup>38</sup> And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God’s love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God’s love. <sup>39</sup> No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord.

**Jeremiah 1:5 (NLT)** <sup>5</sup> “I knew you before I formed you in your mother’s womb. Before you were born I set you apart and appointed you as my prophet to the nations.”

**Psalm 139:13–17 (NLT)**<sup>13</sup> You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother’s womb. <sup>14</sup> Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! **Ephesians 2:10 (ESV)** For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

**1 Peter 1:18–19 (NIV)** <sup>18</sup> For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, <sup>19</sup> but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect.

**2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV)** Therefore, if anyone *is* in Christ, *he is* a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

**1 John 3:1 (NIV)** See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

**Ephesians 1:7 (NIV)** In him we have redemption through his blood, **the forgiveness of sins**, in accordance with the riches of God’s grace

**Colossians 1:13–14 (NKJV)** <sup>13</sup> He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed *us* into the kingdom of the Son of His love, <sup>14</sup> in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

**Isaiah 49:15–16 (NLT)** <sup>15</sup> “Never! Can a mother forget her nursing child? Can she feel no love for the child she has borne? But even if that were possible, I would not forget you! <sup>16</sup> See, I have written your name on the palms of my hands. . .

**Ephesians 2:13 (NLT)** But now you have been united with Christ Jesus. Once you were far away from God, but now you have been brought near to him through the blood of Christ.

**Psalms 23:6 (NLT)** Surely your goodness and unfailing love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will live in the house of the Lord forever.

**Psalms 23:6 (MSG)** Your beauty and love chase after me every day of my life. I’m back home in the house of God for the rest of my life.

**1 Corinthians 2:9 (NLT)** That is what the Scriptures mean when they say, “No eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has imagined what God has prepared for those who love him.”

**1 Corinthians 2:10 (NLT)** But it was to us that God revealed these things by his Spirit. For his Spirit searches out everything and shows us God’s deep secrets.

**1 Peter 2:9 (NKJV)** But you *are* a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light;

**Leviticus 26:12–13 (NLT)** <sup>12</sup>I will walk among you; I will be your God, and you will be my people. <sup>13</sup>I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt so you would no longer be their slaves. I broke the yoke of slavery from your neck so you can walk with your heads held high.
