Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV) ⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith--and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-- ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast.

Colossians 4:6 (NIV) Let your conversation be **always** full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

Proverbs 15:1 (NKJV) A soft answer turns away wrath, But a harsh word stirs up anger.

Proverbs 15:1 (NLT) A gentle answer deflects anger, but harsh words make tempers flare.

Ephesians 4:29 (NKJV) Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers.
