

**John 3:16–17 (NKJV)** <sup>16</sup> For God **so loved the world** that He gave His only begotten Son, that **whoever** believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. <sup>17</sup> For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but **that the world through Him might be saved**.

**John 5:15–16 (NKJV)** <sup>15</sup> The man departed and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well. <sup>16</sup> For this reason the Jews persecuted Jesus, **and sought to kill Him**, because He had done these things on the Sabbath.

**John 5:17 (NLT)** But Jesus replied, “**My Father is always working, and so am I.**”

**Psalms 121:1–8 (NLT)** <sup>1</sup> I look up to the mountains— does my help come from there? <sup>2</sup> My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth! <sup>3</sup> He will not let you stumble; the one who watches over you will not slumber. <sup>4</sup> Indeed, he who watches over Israel never slumbers or sleeps. <sup>5</sup> The Lord himself watches over you! The Lord stands beside you as your protective shade. <sup>6</sup> The sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon at night. <sup>7</sup> The Lord keeps you from all harm and watches over your life. <sup>8</sup> The Lord keeps watch over you as you come and go, both now and forever.

**John 5:18 (NLT)** So the Jewish leaders **tried all the harder to find a way to kill him**. For he not only broke the Sabbath, he called God his Father, thereby making himself equal with God.

**John 5:19–23 (NLT)** <sup>19</sup> So Jesus explained, “**I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself. He does only what he sees the Father doing. Whatever the Father does, the Son also does.** <sup>20</sup> For the Father loves the Son and shows him everything he is doing. In fact, the Father will show him how to do even greater works than healing this man. Then you will truly be astonished. <sup>21</sup> For just as the Father gives life to those he raises from the dead, so the Son gives life to anyone he wants. <sup>22</sup> In addition, the Father judges no one. Instead, he has given the Son absolute authority to judge, <sup>23</sup> so that everyone will honor the Son, just as they honor the Father. Anyone who does not honor the Son is certainly not honoring the Father who sent him.”

**John 5:24–26 (NLT)** <sup>24</sup> “I tell you the truth, those who listen to my message and believe in God who sent me have eternal life. They will never be condemned for their sins, but they have already passed from death into life. <sup>25</sup> “And I assure you that the time is coming, indeed it’s here now, when the dead will hear my voice—the voice of the Son of God. And those who listen will live. <sup>26</sup> The Father has life in himself, and he has granted that same life-giving power to his Son.”

**John 5:36 (NLT)** But I have a greater witness than John—my teachings and my miracles. The Father gave me these works to accomplish, and they prove that he sent me.

**John 5:34 (NLT)** Of course, I have no need of human witnesses, but I say these things **so you might be saved.**

**Romans 5:8 (NIV)** But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: **While we were still sinners**, Christ died for us.

**John 5:24–25 (NLT)** <sup>24</sup> “I tell you the truth, those who listen to my message and believe in God who sent me have eternal life. They will never be condemned for their sins, but **they have already passed from death into life.** <sup>25</sup> “And I assure you that the time is coming, indeed **it’s here now**, when the dead will hear my voice—the voice of the Son of God. And those who listen will live.”

**2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV)** Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.
