

Luke 14:25-33

The Cost

Translation — “And great crowds began to go with Him; therefore He turned and said to them,…” v.25

Translation — “If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and his mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters — yes, and even his own life, he is not able to be my disciple.” v.26

Translation — “Whoever does not take up his own cross and come after me cannot be a disciple of mine.” v.27

Translation — “Now which of you when (because) he wants to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, (to see) if he has (enough resources) to finish it?” v.28

Luke 14:25-33

The Cost

Translation — “Lest after he has laid a foundation and is unable to finish, all those who see it begin to make fun of him,” v.29

Translation — “...by saying. ‘This fellow began to build, but he was unable to finish.’” v.30

Translation — “Or what king marching to attack another king does not first of all sit down and decide whether he is able with ten thousand troops to confront the one coming against him with twenty thousand?” v.31

Translation — “And if in fact he is not, while he is still far distant he will send a diplomat and ask the terms for peace.” v.32

Translation — “In the same way, therefore, everyone of you who does not forsake all that he owns will be unable to be a disciple of mine.” v.33
