

Luke 17:1-10

Forgiveness Comes From Faith

I. Stumbling Blocks vv.1-2

Translation — “And He said to His disciples, ‘It is inevitable that impediments will occur, but woe through whom they come.’” v.1

Translation — “It would be better for him if a millstone were tied about his neck and he were thrown into the sea, than that he offend one of these little ones.” v.2

II. Forgiveness vv.3-4

Translation — “Discipline yourselves. If your brother sins rebuke him, but if he repents, forgive him.” v.3

Translation — “And if he sins against you seven times a day, and seven times he turns to you saying, ‘I repent,’ forgive him.” v.4

III. Faith vv.5-6

Translation — “And the apostles said to the Lord, ‘Give us more faith.’” v.5

Luke 17:1-10

Forgiveness Comes From Faith

Translation — “And the Lord said, ‘If you have faith as big as a mustard seed, you might have said to this mulberry tree, ‘Be uprooted and planted in the sea,’ and it would have obeyed you.’ ” v.6

IV. Servanthood vv.7-10

Translation — “Now which of you who has a servant plowing or keeping sheep, who, when he comes in from the field, will say to him, ‘Come at once and sit down at the table.’ ” v.7

Translation — “Rather will he not say to him, ‘Prepare what I will eat, and get dressed and wait on me while I eat and drink, and after that you yourself may eat and drink.’ ” v.8

Translation — “He does not thank the servant because he did the things which were ordered, does he?” v.9

Translation — “In the same way also you, when you have done all that was commanded you, say, ‘We are poor servants. We have been doing that which we were under obligation to do.’ ” v.10
