Translation — "And He began to show them a parable to the effect that they ought always to prayer and not to become discouraged." v.l
Translation — "Saying, 'There was some judge in a certain city, who neither feared God nor was he ever influenced by men.'" v.2
Translation — "Now there was a widow in that city and she was always coming to him, saying. 'Award compensation for me from my adversary.'" v.3
Translation — "But he was not willing for a while; however later he said to himself, 'Though in fact I do not fear God, nor have consideration for man'" v.4

Luke 18:1-14 Parables on Prayer II The Pharisee and the Tax Collector vy 9-14

II. The Pharisee and the Tax Collector VV.9-14
Translation — "And He also spoke to those who had always trusted in themselves that they were righteous and looked down upon the others, this parable." v.9
Translation — "Two men went up into the temple to pray: the one was a Pharisee and the other was a revenue officer." v.10
Translation — "The Pharisee stood up and began to pray as follows to himself: 'O God! I thank you that I am not like the rest of mankind — extortioners, dishonest, adulterers or especially like this revenue official.'" v.II
Translation — "I fast regularly twice a week. I always give back ten percent of al of that which I get." v.12

Translation — "But when the revenue official had taken his place far away, he was unwilling to lift his eyes to heaven, but began to beat upon his breast saying, 'O God be reconciled unto me the sinner.'" v.13
