

Luke 20:9-19

Owner or Farmer

I. The Parable of the Vineyard v.9

Translation — “And He began to narrate this parable to the people: Some man planted a vineyard and leased it to farmers and went away for a long time.” v.9

II. The Required Harvest vv.10-12

Translation — “And at harvest time he sent to the farmers a servant, in order that they might give him some of the fruit of the vineyard, but after they had beaten him the farmers sent him away empty handed.” v.10

Translation — “And he proceeded to send another servant, but when they had beaten and insulted him, they sent him away empty handed.” v.11

Translation — “And he proceeded to send a third, but after they had wounded him also they cast him out.” v.12

III. The Owner’s Son vv.13-15

Translation — “And the owner of the vineyard said, ‘What shall I do? I will send my son, the beloved one. Perhaps they will respect him.’” v.13

Luke 20:9-19

Owner or Farmer

Translation — “But when they saw him the farmers began to reason with one another saying, ‘This is the heir. Let us kill him so that the inheritance may become ours.’” v.14

Translation — “So they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. What, then, will the lord of the vineyard do to them?” v.15

IV. The Results of Rejection vv.16-19

Translation — “He will come and he will destroy those farmers and he will give the vineyard to others. But when they heard it they said, ‘May it never be!’ ” v.16

Translation — “And He looked up and said to them, ‘What then does this scripture mean, The stone which the builders rejected - that one has become the corner stone?’ ” v.17

Luke 20:9-19

Owner or Farmer

Translation — “Everyone who falls upon that stone will be broken, but upon whom it may fall - it will pulverize him.” v.18

Translation — “And the scribes and the chief priests began to try to lay their hands on Him at that time, but they were afraid of the people, because they realized that He had spoken this parable against them.” v.19
