1. <u>REVIEW</u>

- A. A BRIEF SUMMARY OF JAMES 1:2-18
 - 1. IN CHAPTER 1, JAMES ARGUED THAT WHEN FAITH IS PUT TO THE TEST IT CAN PRODUCE GENUINE STABILITY. TO DEMONSTRATE THIS POINT, HE GAVE <u>TWO</u> EXAMPLES.
 - a. FIRST, HE ARGUED THAT THE NORMAL TRIALS OF LIFE DON'T CRUSH GENUINE FAITH... THEY PRODUCE ENDURANCE (1:1-12).
 - b. <u>SECOND</u>, HE URGED HIS READERS TO <u>OVERCOME</u> <u>TEMPTATIONS</u> <u>TO</u> <u>SIN</u> BY <u>RELYING</u> ON <u>GOD-GIVEN</u> <u>STRENGTH</u> (1:13-18).
- B. IN <u>DEVELOPING</u> HIS <u>MAIN THEME</u> THAT <u>REAL</u> <u>FAITH</u> <u>PRODUCES</u> <u>GENUINE</u> <u>WORKS</u> JAMES <u>DISCUSSES</u>:
 - 1. THE <u>CHRISTIAN'S PERSEVERANCE THROUGH TRIALS</u>,
 - a. WHICH PROVES OUR FAITH (1:1-12),
 - 2. AND THE BELIEVER'S VICTORY OVER TEMPTATION,
 - a. WHICH <u>DEMONSTRATES</u> OUR <u>CHARACTER</u> (1:13-18).
 - 3. IN THIS <u>FINAL SECTION</u> OF CHAPTER 1, JAMES' EMPHASIS IS ON THE <u>BELIEVER'S APPROPRIATE RESPONSE TO GOD'S WORD</u>.
 - a. THE <u>BREAK</u> IN THE <u>RELATIONSHIP</u> BETWEEN <u>BELIEF</u> AND <u>BEHAVIOR</u> MAY BE <u>PANDEMIC</u> AMONG <u>CHRISTIANS</u>, <u>BUT</u> JAMES <u>REMINDS</u> <u>US</u> THAT THE <u>TWO ESTRANGED</u> <u>PARTNERS</u> OF THE <u>CHRISTIAN WALK</u> (<u>BELIEF</u> AND <u>BEHAVIOR</u>) <u>CAN BE RECONCILED</u>.
- C. James 1:19-27 (TLB) Dear brothers, don't ever forget that it is best to listen much, speak little, and not become angry; for anger doesn't make us good, as God demands that we must be. So get rid of all that is wrong in your life, both inside and outside, and humbly be glad for the wonderful message we have received, for it is able to save our souls as it takes hold of our hearts. And remember, it is a message to obey, not just to listen to. So don't fool

yourselves. For if a person just listens and doesn't obey, he is like a man looking at his face in a mirror; as soon as he walks away, he can't see himself anymore or remember what he looks like. But if anyone keeps looking steadily into God's law for free men, he will not only remember it but he will do what it says, and God will greatly bless him in everything he does. Anyone who says he is a Christian but doesn't control his sharp tongue is just fooling himself, and his religion isn't worth much. The Christian who is pure and without fault, from God the Father's point of view, is the one who takes care of orphans and widows, and who remains true to the Lord — not soiled and dirtied by his contacts with the world.

- D. James 1:19-27 (NASB) This you know, my beloved brethren. But everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger; for the anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God. Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls. But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks at his natural face in a mirror; for once he has looked at himself and gone away, he has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was. But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the *law* of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does. If anyone thinks himself to be religious, and yet does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is worthless. Pure and undefiled religion in the sight of *our* God and Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.
- 2. INTRODUCTION: TODAY WE'RE GOING TO DISCUSS THE DELICATE SUBJECT OF <u>DIVORCE</u>.... NOT A <u>DIVORCE</u> BETWEEN A <u>HUSBAND AND WIFE</u> THAT OCCURS IN A <u>HOME</u>. <u>BUT</u>... A <u>DIVORCE</u> THAT <u>OCCURS</u> IN THE <u>LIFE</u> <u>OF</u> <u>A</u> <u>BELIEVER BETWEEN</u> THE <u>TRUTH</u> THAT IS <u>HEARD</u>... <u>BUT</u> IS <u>NOT</u> <u>LIVED</u>. THIS <u>DIVORCE</u> IS A RADICAL <u>SEPARATION</u> BETWEEN THE <u>TRUTH</u> AND THE <u>LIFE</u>. THE <u>REASON</u> FOR THIS <u>DIVORCE</u> IS <u>NOT</u> <u>RELATIONAL</u> <u>INCOMPATIBILITY</u>. IT IS A

MATTER OF <u>PERSONAL</u> <u>INCONSISTENCY</u> THAT IS CARRIED OUT IN <u>PUBLIC</u> FOR <u>ALL</u> TO <u>SEE</u>.

- A. FOR MANY OF US CHRISTIANS, <mark>GOD'S</mark> WORD FAILS TO MAKE IT FROM OUR <u>HEAD</u> TO OUR <u>HEART</u>.
- B. AND FOR MANY MORE OF US, HIS WORD GETS STUCK BETWEEN OUR <u>HEART</u> AND OUR <u>HANDS</u>.
- C. TO A CASUAL <u>OBSERVER</u> IT APPEARS THAT MANY <u>CHRISTIANS</u> WANT TO <u>ENJOY</u> THE <u>THRILL</u> OF <u>FEELING</u> <u>RIGHT</u> <u>BUT</u> ARE <u>NOT</u> <u>WILLING</u> TO <u>ENDURE</u> THE <u>INCONVENIENCE</u> OF <u>LIVING</u> <u>RIGHT</u>.
 - 1. SO THERE IS A <u>DIVORCE</u> BETWEEN <u>THEORY</u> AND <u>PRACTICE</u>!
- D. IN THE FINAL SECTION OF CHAPTER 1, <u>JAMES'</u> <u>EMPHASIS</u> IS ON THE <u>BELIEVER'S</u> <u>APPROPRIATE</u> <u>RESPONSE</u> TO <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u>.
- **3.** <u>James 1:19-20</u> (NASB) *This* you know, my beloved brethren. But everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak *and* slow to anger; for the anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God.
 - A. JAMES <u>BEGINS</u> THIS SECTION WITH "This you know, my beloved brethren."
 - 1. "<u>YOU KNOW</u>" IS A <u>REMINDER</u>... AS WELL AS A <u>REBUKE</u>... = "<u>YOU'VE</u> <u>FORGOTTEN</u>!"
 - B. THREE THINGS THAT JAMES SAYS <u>MUST</u> BE "<u>REMEMBERED</u>" IN <u>PREPARATION</u> TO <u>RECEIVE</u> <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u>:
 - 1. FIRST ... JAMES URGES US TO BE "quick to hear".
 - a. THE <u>IDEA</u> HERE IS <mark>MORE</mark> <u>THAN</u> JUST <u>HEARING</u>... IT IS <u>LISTENING</u> <u>INTENTLY</u>.
 - 1) JAMES WANTS US TO <u>GENUINELY</u> <u>RECEIVE</u> THE <u>WORDS</u> THAT ARE WRITTEN.
 - 2) AS IN THERE ARE <u>TWO WAYS</u> OF <u>READING</u> A <u>BOOK</u>.
 - i. TO GET <u>THROUGH</u> IT.

ii. TO READ FOR <u>COMPREHENSION</u>.

- 3) <u>Matthew 13:13-14a</u> (NASB) "Therefore I speak to them in parables; because while seeing they do not see, and while hearing they do not hear, nor do they <u>understand</u>. "In their case the prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled, which says, 'YOU WILL KEEP ON <u>HEARING</u>, BUT WILL <u>NOT UNDERSTAND</u>;
- 4) <u>Matthew 13:20-23</u> (NASB) "The one on whom seed was sown on the rocky places, this is the man who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet he has no *firm* root in himself, but is *only* temporary, and when affliction or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he falls away. "And the one on whom seed was sown among the thorns, this is the man who hears the word, and the worry of the world and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful. "And the one on whom seed was sown on the good soil, this is the man who hears the word and <u>understands</u> it; who indeed bears fruit and brings forth, some a hundredfold, some sixty, and some thirty."
- b. **<u>DISCUSS</u>** THE WAY MANY OF US <u>**READ</u>** THE "ONE YEAR BIBLE".</u>

1) TO CHECK THAT DAY OFF OUR LIST.

- 2. <u>SECOND</u>... TO <u>RECEIVE</u> <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u> <u>EFFECTIVELY</u> ALSO <u>INCLUDES</u> <u>BEING</u> "<u>slow to speak</u>".
 - a. PUTTING A <u>DAMPER</u> <u>ON</u> <u>OUR</u> <u>TONGUE</u> IS THE <u>OTHER</u> <u>SIDE</u> OF <u>LISTENING</u>.
 - b. KEEPING OUR <u>MOUTHS CLOSED</u> MAKES <u>ROOM FOR THINKING</u>, <u>PONDERING</u>, <u>MEDITATING</u>, AND <u>CONSIDERING</u>—<u>ALL</u> THE <u>ELEMENTS</u> <u>NECESSARY</u> FOR <u>TRUE LISTENING</u> = <u>UNDERSTANDING</u>.
 - 1) IT IS <u>NOT POSSIBLE</u> TO <u>LISTEN</u> <u>WHILE</u> WE ARE <u>TALKING</u>!

- 2) TOO MANY OF US TALK TOO MUCH AND THEREFORE ARE NOT ABLE TO "HEAR" WHAT OTHERS ARE SAYING.
- 3) THE <u>ARMED SERVICES</u> DO AN EXCELENT JOB OF <u>TEACHING</u> THEIR MEMBERS TO "<u>LISTEN</u>".
- 3. THIRD... "slow to anger"
 - a. IN THE GREEK THERE IS <u>NO</u> "<u>and</u>" BETWEEN "slow to speak <u>and</u> slow to anger"
 - = "quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger" ARE <u>SO</u> <u>CLOSELY</u> <u>RELATED</u> TO THE <u>PRECONDITION</u> FOR <u>RECEIVING</u> <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u> THAT JAMES <u>CONCEIVES</u> OF THEM AS <u>BEING</u> <u>CONNECTED</u> LIKE <u>LINKS</u> IN A <u>CHAIN</u>.
 - b. WHY DID JAMES INCLUDE "ANGER" IN THIS LIST?
 - 1) PAUL WROTE, "ALL SCRIPTURE IS INSPIRED BY GOD AND PROFITABLE FOR <u>TEACHING</u>, FOR <u>REPROOF</u>, FOR <u>CORRECTION</u>, FOR <u>TRAINING IN</u> RIGHTEOUSNESS" (2 TIM. 3:16).
 - 2) <u>WHEN GOD'S WORD HITS</u> TOO <u>CLOSE</u> <u>TO HOME</u>, WE OFTEN <u>REACT</u> WITH <u>DEFENSIVENESS</u>, <u>INDIGNATION</u>, AND EVEN <u>ANGER</u>.
 - 3) WE DO NOT LIKE HAVING OUR THOUGHTS AND ACTIONS BEING HELD UP TO A PERFECT STANDARD. <u>BUT</u> THAT'S JUST <u>WHAT</u> HAPPENS WHEN WE LET <u>GOD'S WORD</u> EXPOSE OUR INNERMOST THOUGHTS AND ACTIONS.
 - 4) <u>Hebrews 4:12</u> (NASB) For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.
 - i. <u>GOD'S WORD IS ABLE TO GO WHERE NO SURGEON'S <mark>SCALPEL</mark> CAN EVER <u>GO</u>!</u>

- 5) INSTEAD OF ALLOWING THE TYPICAL <u>RESPONSE</u> OF <u>ANGER</u>, WHEN CONFRONTED WITH WHAT GOD'S WORD SAYS, JAMES CALLS US TO <u>RESPOND</u> IN <u>PEACE</u>, "for the <u>anger</u> of man does not achieve the righteousness of God" (James 1:20).
- 6) ANGER REJECTS REBUKE; PEACE ACCEPTS REBUKE.
 - i. <u>ANGER DISMISSES</u> <u>CORRECTION</u>; <u>PEACE</u> <u>EMBRACES</u> <u>CORRECTION</u>.
- James 1:21 (NASB) Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and *all* that remains of wickedness, in humility <u>receive</u> the word implanted, which is able to save your souls.
 - A. <u>James 1:21</u> (TLB) "So get rid of all that is wrong in your life, both inside and outside, and humbly be glad for the wonderful message we have received, for it is able to save our souls as it takes hold of our hearts."
 - B. <u>WHEN</u> WE HAVE <u>PREPARED</u> TO <u>RECEIVE</u> <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u> (THE TRUTH) BY <u>LISTENING</u> (OPENING THE EARS OF THE HEART), <u>ZIPPING</u> <u>OUR</u> <u>LIPS</u>, AND SUPPRESSING THE URGE TO STRIKE BACK IN <u>ANGER</u> (1:19-20), THEN WE ARE <u>READY</u> TO <u>PROPERLY</u> <u>RECEIVE</u> THE <u>TRUTH OF GOD'S WORD</u> (1:21).
 - C. IN THE <u>CENTER</u> OF THIS SHORT VERSE IS A <u>SIMPLE</u> <u>COMMAND</u> THAT <u>TIES</u> THE WHOLE <u>SECTION</u> <u>TOGETHER</u>: "<u>RECEIVE</u>" (DECHOMAI).
 - 1. THE WORD "<u>RECEIVE</u>" USUALLY MEANS <u>MORE</u> THAN TO <u>PASSIVELY</u> "<u>ACCEPT</u>."
 - a. IT OFTEN INCLUDES THE IDEA OF <mark>FULLY</mark> <u>EMBRACING</u>, AND MAKING THE THING <u>PART OF ONESELF</u>.
 - <u>Acts 17:10-12</u> (NASB) The brethren immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea, and when they arrived, they went into the synagogue of the Jews. Now these were more nobleminded than those in Thessalonica, for they <u>received</u> the word with <u>great eagerness</u>, examining the Scriptures daily *to see*

whether these things were so. **Therefore many of them believed**, along with a number of prominent Greek women and men.

- b. JAMES DESCRIBES THE <u>CONDITIONS</u> THAT <u>MUST</u> <u>ACCOMPANY</u> THE <u>RECEPTION</u> OF <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u>: "putting aside all filthiness and *all* that remains of wickedness, in humility..."(NASB) ... "So get rid of all that is wrong in your life, both inside and outside, and humbly be glad for the wonderful message we have received" (NLT)
 - 1) FILTHINESS IN LIFE PLUGS OUR HEARING.
 - 2) WICKEDNESS SLOWS OUR RESPONSE TIME.
 - 3) <u>PRIDE</u> (IN <u>CONTRAST</u> TO "<u>HUMILITY</u>") <u>KEEPS</u> <u>US</u> FROM <u>EXPOSING</u> <u>OURSELVES</u> TO THE <u>LIGHT</u> OF THE <u>WORD</u>.
 - 4) <u>BUT</u>... "<u>HUMILITY</u>" MEANS <u>SUBMITTING</u> <u>TO</u> <u>WHATEVER</u> <u>GOD'S</u> <u>WORD</u> HAS TO <u>SAY TO</u> <u>US</u>.
- James 1:21 (NASB) Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word <u>implanted</u>, which is able to save your souls.
 - A. JAMES'S <u>PROGRESSION</u> OF <u>PREPARING</u> FOR, <u>RECEIVING</u>, AND <u>RESPONDING</u> TO THE <u>TRUTH</u> IS <u>SIMPLE</u> AND <u>ELEGANT</u>... IT RELATES TO <u>FARMING</u>... SEE <u>Luke 8:11-15</u> (NASB) "Now the parable is this: the seed is the word of God. "Those beside the road are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their heart, so that they will not believe and be saved. "Those on the rocky soil are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no firm root; they believe for a while, and in time of temptation fall away. "The seed which fell among the thorns, these are the ones who have heard, and as they go on their way they are choked with worries and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to maturity. "But the seed in the good soil, these are the ones who have heard the word in an honest and good heart, and hold it fast, and bear fruit with perseverance.:

- FIRST, JAMES SAYS THAT THE SOIL OF OUR SOULS SHOULD BE PREPARED ... James 1:19-20 (NASB) This you know, my beloved brethren. But everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger; for the anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God.
- <u>SECOND</u>, THE <u>SEED</u> OF <u>TRUTH</u> MUST BE <u>PLANTED</u>... <u>James 1:21</u> (NASB) Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and *all* that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word <u>implanted</u>, which is able to save your souls.
- THIRD, THE WEEDS OF ANGER, FILTH, AND WICKEDNESS MUST BE <u>UPROOTED</u>... James 1:20-21a (NASB) for the anger of man does not achieve the righteousness of God. Therefore, putting aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness,
- 4. <u>HOWEVER</u>, HAVING GOTTEN THIS FAR IN THE <u>PROCESS</u>, <u>GOD'S WORD</u> STILL HAS <u>NOT</u> BORNE <u>FRUIT</u> IN <u>OUR LIVES</u>.
 - a. THIS REQUIRES A PROPER RESPONSE
 - b. THE <u>PROPER RESPONSE</u> TO <u>GOD'S WORD</u> IS FOUND IN <u>James</u> <u>1:22-27</u> WHICH WE WILL COVER NEXT WEEK.
