### 1. REVIEW

- A. <u>Luke 11:1-4</u> (NASB77) And it came about that while He was <u>praying</u> in a certain place, after He had finished, one of His disciples said to Him, "<u>Lord</u>, <u>teach us to pray</u> just as John also taught his disciples." And He said to them, "When you pray, say: '(1) <u>Father</u>, (2) <u>hallowed be Thy name</u>. (3) <u>Thy kingdom come</u>. (4) '<u>Give us each day our daily bread</u>. 'And (5) <u>forgive us our sins</u>, For (6) <u>we ourselves also forgive everyone who is indebted to us</u>. And (7) lead us not into temptation.'"
  - 1. 1-3 ARE OUR ORIENTATION.
  - 2. 4-7 ARE PETITIONS.
  - 3. NOTICE THE ORDER: ORIENTATION BEFORE PETITION.
- B. FACT: THERE IS NOTHING MORE IMPORTANT IN OUR SPIRITUAL GROWTH THAN PRAYER.
- C. THE DISCIPLES REALIZED THAT <u>IF</u> THEY WERE GOING TO <u>FOLLOW JESUS</u> AND <u>DO WHAT GOD WAS GOING TO ASK THEM TO DO</u>, THEY WERE GOING TO <u>HAVE TO MAKE PRAYER A SUPREME PRIORITY</u>.
  - 1. THEY GOT THE MESSAGE, BECAUSE BY <u>ACTS 6</u> THEY <u>REALIZED</u> <u>THE NECESSITY OF THEM <u>SPENDING</u> <u>TIME</u> <u>WITH</u> <u>GOD</u> <u>IN PRAYER</u>.</u>
    - a. Acts 6:2-4 (NASB) And the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables. "But select from among you, brethren, seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. "But we will devote ourselves to prayer, and to the ministry of the word."
  - 2. QUESTION: HOW MANY THINGS <u>DO WE SAY</u> "NO" <u>TO IN ORDER TO PRAY</u>??
- D. JESUS <u>RESPONDS</u> TO THE REQUEST, "LORD, TEACH US TO PRAY", IN <u>TWO</u> <u>PARTS</u>:
  - 1. FIRST, A MODEL OF A PRAYER TO PRAY. (LUKE 11:1-4)
  - 2. <u>SECOND</u>, OUR <u>PERSPECTIVES</u> WHILE <u>PRAYING</u>. (<u>LUKE 11:5-13</u>)
    - a. PRAY LIKE OUR PRAYERS MATTER.
    - b. TRUST THAT GOD IS A GOOD FATHER.
- 2. THE FIRST PERSPECTIVE: PRAY LIKE OUR PRAYERS MATTER

- A. Luke 11:5-13 (NASB) And He said to them, "Suppose one of you shall have a friend, and shall go to him at midnight, and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves; for a friend of mine has come to me from a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; and from inside he shall answer and say, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been shut and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' "I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will get up and give him as much as he needs. "And I say to you, ask, and it shall be given to you; seek, and you shall find; knock, and it shall be opened to you. "For everyone who asks, receives; and he who seeks, finds; and to him who knocks, it shall be opened. "Now suppose one of you fathers is asked by his son for a fish; he will not give him a snake instead of a fish, will he? "Or if he is asked for an egg, he will not give him a scorpion, will he? " If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?"
- B. THIS PERSPECTIVE (PRAYING LIKE OUR PRAYERS MATTER) IS VITAL BECAUSE... WITHOUT IT WE PROBABLY WILL NOT PERSEVERE IN PRAYER.
- C. "Suppose one of you shall have **a friend**, and shall go to him **at midnight**, and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves; for a friend of mine has come to me from a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; and from inside he shall answer and say, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been shut and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you *anything*.'
  - 1. NOTE: IN JESUS' TIME HOSPITALITY WAS NOT A COURTESY... IT WAS AN OBLIGATION.
- D. "I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him *anything* <u>because</u> <u>he is his friend</u>, yet because of his <u>persistence</u> he <u>will get up</u> and <u>give him as much as he needs</u>.
  - 1. A <u>BETTER TRANSLATION</u> OF "<u>PERSISTENCE</u>" IS, "because of his <u>SHAMELESS AUDICITY</u> he <u>will get up</u> and give <u>him as much as he needs</u>.

- 2. THE IDEA HERE IS THAT THIS MAN IS SO DESPERATE THAT EVEN THOUGH HIS FRIEND SAYS, "<u>IDo not bother me</u>; the door has already been shut and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you *anything.*'
- E. BECAUSE OF HIS "SHAMELESS AUDACITY" THE MAN IN BED WILL, "get up and give him as much as he needs.
- F. JESUS ADDS, "And I say to you, ask, and it shall be given to you; seek, and you shall find; knock, and it shall be opened to you. "For everyone who asks, receives; and he who seeks, finds; and to him who knocks, it shall be opened.
  - 1. ASK, SEEK, AND KNOCK ARE VERBS IN THE PRESENT PROGRESSIVE TENSE.
    - a. WHICH <u>MEANS</u> THAT THEY <u>IMPLY</u> <u>CONTINOUS</u> <u>ACTION</u>.
    - b. <u>KEEP ASKING</u>, <u>KEEP SEEKING</u>, AND <u>KEEP KNOCKING</u>.
      - 1) <u>THAT</u> IS WHAT <u>OUR</u> <u>PERSPECTIVE</u> <u>SHOULD</u> <u>BE</u> AS WE <u>PRAY</u>!!
    - c. NOTE: "A S K" IS AN ACROSTIC WORD.
      - 1) A = ASK
      - $2) S = \frac{SEEK}{}$
      - 3) K = **KNOCK**
- G. THIS <u>PARABLE</u> IS <u>NOT</u> TO TELL US <u>WHAT</u> <u>GOD</u> <u>IS</u> <u>LIKE</u> (A GRUMPY, SLEEPY MAN IN BED)... <u>BUT</u>, WHAT <u>WE</u> <u>SHOULD</u> <u>BE</u> <u>LIKE</u> AS WE <u>PRAY</u>.
  - 1. IN OTHER WORDS, IT'S <u>NOT</u> ABOUT <u>HOW GOD</u> <u>RESPONDS</u> <u>TO PRAYER</u>, <u>BUT</u>... <u>HOW</u> WE SHOULD <u>APPROACH GOD</u> <u>IN PRAYER</u>.
    - a. <u>OUR PERSPECTIVE</u> SHOULD BE TO <u>KEEP</u> <u>ASKING</u>, <u>KEEP</u> <u>SEEKING</u>, AND <u>KEEP</u> <u>KNOCKING</u>.
- 3. THEN JESUS TELLS THE <u>DISCIPLES</u> AND <u>US</u> <u>WHY</u> <u>CONTINOUS</u> <u>ASKING</u>,

  <u>SEEKING</u>, AND <u>KNOCKING</u> SHOULD <u>BE OUR PERSPECTIVE</u> <u>WHEN WE PRAY</u>...

- A. "And I say to you, ask, and it shall be given to you; seek, and you shall find; knock, and it shall be opened to you. "For everyone who asks, receives; and he who seeks, finds; and to him who knocks, it shall be opened.
- B. PROBLEM: MOST CHRISTIANS DO NOT BELIEVE WHAT JESUS SAID IN THIS SCRIPTURE, BECAUSE... IF WE DID, WE WOULD PRAY A LOT MORE THAN WE DO!
- C. MANY OF YOU ARE THINKING:
  - 1. "I WISH PRAYER WAS THAT EASY!"
  - 2. OR, "I USED TO BELIEVE PRAYER WORKED LIKE THAT".
  - 3. OR, "SOMETHING <u>BAD</u> HAPPENED IN MY LIFE AND I <u>ASKED</u>, I <u>SAUGHT</u>, AND I <u>KNOCKED</u>... BUT, <u>I</u> <u>DID</u> <u>NOT</u> <u>GET</u> <u>MY</u> <u>ANSWER</u>".
- D. QUESSTION: WHAT DO WE DO WITH AND HOW DO WE HANDLE "NO" OR "LATER" TO OUR PRAYERS?
  - 1. I WANT TO POINT OUT TWO THINGS HERE:
    - a. JESUS DID <u>NOT</u> SAY <u>WHEN</u> <u>WE WILL</u> <u>RECEIVE</u>.
      - 1) GOD IS NOT AN "ON DEMAND GOD".
    - b. <u>SOMETIMES</u> HIS <u>ANSWER</u> IS "<u>NO</u>".
      - 1) GOD <u>ALWAYS</u> <mark>ANSWERS</mark> OUR <u>PRAYERS</u>: <u>YES</u>, <u>NO</u>, <u>LATER</u>.
- **4.** <u>Luke 11:11-13</u> (NASB) "Now suppose one of you fathers is asked by his son for a fish; he will not give him a snake instead of a fish, will he? "Or *if* he is asked for an egg, he will not give him a scorpion, will he? "If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more shall *your* heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?"
  - A. IN THIS PASSAGE, JESUS IS USING A STYLE OF <u>RABINIC TEACHING</u> CALLED "HOW MUCH MORE".
    - 1. HE IS SPEAKING IN <u>EXAGGERATED</u> <u>LANGUAGE</u> TO <u>MAKE</u> <u>A</u> <u>POINT</u>.

- a. IF \_\_\_\_\_ IS TRUE... THEN <u>HOW MUCH MORE</u> IS \_\_\_\_\_ TRUE?
- b. AND HIS POINT IS THAT THE WAY BROKEN <u>HUMAN FATHERS</u>

  RESPOND TO THEIR CHILDREN IS NOTHING COMPARED TO THE WAY

  OUR <u>HEAVENLY FATHER</u> LOVINGLY <u>RESPONDS</u> TO <u>US</u>.
- B. **DO NOT MISS THIS**:
  - 1. WHEN JESUS DESCRIBES OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD IN PRAYER, HE DOES NOT DESCRIBE:
    - a. A **KING** AND HIS **SUBJECTS**.
    - b. OR, A MASTER AND HIS SLAVE.
    - c. **BUT...** A **FATHER** AND HIS **CHILDREN**!
    - d. **DISCUSS**: WHY?
- C. QUESTION: WHY DOES JESUS SAY THAT GOD WILL SEND THE HOLY SPIRIT TO THOSE WHO ASK HIM?
  - THAT SEEMS RATHER ODD IF THAT'S NOT WHAT YOU'RE ASKING FOR.
  - 2. <u>NOTE</u>: WHEN JESUS GAVE THIS TEACHING THE HOLY SPIRIT DID <u>NOT INDWELL/LIVE IN BELIEVERS</u>.
    - a. HE DID COME ON PROPHETS, ETC. IN O.T. TIMES...
      - 1) BUT IT WAS <u>ALWAYS</u> <u>TEMPORARY</u>.
    - b. THEREFORE... IF GOD WERE TO GIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT

      PERMANENTLY, THAT WOULD BE THE GREATEST GIFT GOD COULD

      EVER GIVE!
      - 1) John 14:25-26 (NASB) "These things I have spoken to you, while abiding with you. "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you.
- 5. SUMMARY: TWO VITAL PERSPECTIVES JESUS WANTS US TO LEARN FROM THIS TEACHING ABOUT PRAYER:

- A. REMEMBER, IN <u>LUKE 11: 1-13</u>, WHEN THE <u>DISCIPLES</u> SAY, "<u>LORD</u>, <u>TEACH US</u>

  TO <u>PRAY</u>"... HE GIVES A <u>TWO PART ANSWER</u>:
  - 1. A MODEL FOR PRAYER (Luke 11:1-4).
  - 2. A PERSPECTIVE WHILE PRAYING (Luke II: 5-13).
- B. OUR FIRST PERSPECTIVE: PRAY LIKE OUR PRAYERS MATTER.
- C. OUR <u>SECOND</u> <u>PERSPECTIVE</u>: <u>TRUST</u> <u>THAT</u> <u>GOD</u> <u>IS</u> <u>A</u> <u>GOOD</u> <u>FATHER</u>.
