Realm® Connect



A Message From Paston Dan

Always Thankful

What was the mathematician thankful for? The pi. What was the turkey suspected of? Fowl play. How do hot dogs say thank you? Franks a lot! OK, OK ... just one more...

What was the seamstress thankful for on Thanksgiving? Sew much.

Paul tells us we are to be "giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Eph. 5:20)

We really do have so much to be thankful for, don't we?!

First and foremost – for those who are Christians, we should be supremely thankful for our salvation. That is a gift from God that we should always thank Him for ... regularly thank Him. That is an irrevocable gift that our great God has given us.

We should also be thankful for so many other blessings God has given us: our family, our friends, for God's daily provision, for the health He gives us, for our jobs, for the beauty of God's creation, for coffee (or tea), for good food, chocolate, for shelter, for clothes, for our freedom we have as Americans, for our church ... and that doesn't even begin to scratch the surface.

But look back to the verse above...we are to be thankful for everything. I have to admit ... this is not easy for me. I try but I often fail at this. It is easy to celebrate the birth of a child ... but the loss of a child is beyond words. It is easy to celebrate a new job ... but loss of a job or continued



no's while looking for a job can be discouraging. A great health report from your doc is worth celebrating ... but hearing from the doctor about a scan not looking good or needing to go back in for more surgery, well that can be devastating.

But we are told to give thanks "for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

When we do this, it reminds us that God is working for us. He is not hands-off, but very hands-on and has a plan for us. When God promised that He makes "all things work together for good," it is not some universal idiom that all things end up turning out for good for everyone. No ... in fact this is a promise for Christians (those who love God ... who are called according to His purpose) that in God's time, He is doing something in your life that is good. And so, we are told to be thankful – even in that situation – to God and in the name of Jesus. That "mountain" you are staring at ... God's got you!


