Here's to Good Health!



April is National Cancer Month.

Cancer is a disease of the body's cells. We have billons of cells in our bodies. Normal, healthy cells will reproduce by dividing for the purpose of growth and repair of body tissue.

If a cell begins to divide too rapidly and without any order, a growth (tumor) can form. A tumor can be benign (not cancerous) or malignant (cancerous). A benign tumor will usually not spread to surrounding tissue; a malignant tumor can.

Cancer can afflict men, women and children of all ages. There are 7 warning signs of cancer. If you experience any of these signs, see your health care provider immediately.

- Any change in bladder or bowel habits.
- A lump or thickening in the breast or elsewhere.
- Unusual bleeding or discharge.
- ♦ A sore that doesn't heal.
- Indigestion or difficulty swallowing.
- An obvious change in a wart or mole.
- Nagging cough or hoarseness.



May is National High Blood Pressure Month.

High blood pressure can be caused by too much salt in your diet. Salt (sodium) the element in salt that your body uses, it is one of the most important minerals involved in many life processes. You couldn't live without it. But your body needs only 2,000 milligrams a day – the amount in one teaspoon of salt. Excess sodium contributes to high blood pressure and possibly to the formation of kidney stones. Here are some ways to eat less sodium and get past your salt cravings.

- Avoid canned and processed foods.
- Stay away from cured or smoked meats.
- Try other seasoning like herbs, spices, lemon juice, onions, salsa and hot sauce.
- Use half the salt called for in a recipe.
- Take the salt shaker off the table.
- Taste food before you salt it. You may be surprised at how good some foods taste without salt.
- When shopping, check the nutritional information on packaged foods. Choose foods that provide less than 10% of your daily allowance of sodium.
- Beware of hidden sodium. Eggs, dairy products, beets and alcoholic beverages are examples of high sodium foods that don't taste salty.

As always remember to wash your hands!
