Here's to Good Health!

I Have often "talked" about eating healthy, so my article this time is a reminder that our eating habits need to be in moderation, and most days you need to have a balanced and nutritious diet.

April is BLT sandwich month! Made with bacon, lettuce, and tomato, it can be a breakfast sandwich as well as a delicious lunch sandwich. The most popular way to have it is on toasted bread. Think about whole wheat or a multi grain bread.

The BLT sandwich is the second most popular sandwich in the United States. Traditionally, it includes several slices of cooked bacon (think about using turkey bacon), iceberg lettuce or maybe a spring mix, and slices of tomato between toasted bread. Mayonnaise is the traditional condiment for the BLT.

The BLT sandwich is believed to have descended from the tea sandwiches served in the Victorian Era. They became popular after World War II because of the rapid expansion of supermarkets that made BLT ingredients available year round.

Or you could make a BLT salad. Just shred the lettuce, add diced tomatoes, and toss in some bacon bits. You could also add slices of avocado and top with croutons. Add your favorite dressing.

May is the time to think about planting a garden. Is there anything better than a vine-ripened tomatoes or other fresh produce? Why not think about growing a few of your own edible plants? Use a raised flower bed, or a few pots on your patio or deck. Gardening can be fun, rewarding, and healthy. Other benefits of gardening include getting outdoors, keeping active, and sitting less. It can also be a great stress reliever and improve your diet as you eat more fruits and vegetables.

Gardening might enhance mental health as well. Being in the outdoors in the sunshine and being in nature can improve your mood. Digging in the dirt can increase physical activity and give you a feeling of well-being and connection with our Creator.

No matter where you get your fruits and veggies- your own garden, farmers market, or grocery store- just make sure you eat plenty of fruits and veggies every day.

Update from the Lead Team

For 2025, Covenant adopted a new, streamlined model for church leadership, the Lead Team. This new model differs from the Leadership team model that the church used in the past. The Lead Team consists of church members who represent various ministries and committees. Additionally, the Lead Team itself serves as the Trustees, Finance Committee, and SPRC Committee. We combined all the administrative committees into one committee to minimize meetings and support our focus on ministry. The committee meets every two months, beginning in January on the 3rd Tuesday at 7pm. Here is an update from the March meeting:

- In 2026, our Casavant Organ will be 100 years old. We are preparing to celebrate this
 milestone and need to schedule significant maintenance for the organ. The cost will be
 substantial and will require a collective effort from our congregation. More information
 will be provided later this year.
- The Child Care Center turned 30 years old in February. We will be celebrating during our community event on May 17th in the church parking lot.
- The Child Care Center received a \$50,000 grant, which will allow us to expand by opening an additional room in the center. We hope to support more families and generate more revenue for the Child Care Center.
- In preparation for Easter Sunday, the church will have the lighting in the sanctuary repaired. Meadow Valley Electric will be replacing the burned-out light bulbs.
- On April 12th, we will be conducting some specific maintenance and cleanup around the church beginning immediately after the food box giveaway. If you are handy with a pole saw, please join us in the parking lot.

Church Staff Appreciation Luncheons

Ten church staff members of Covenant United Methodist Church were honored by Lead Team/SPRC at appreciation luncheons during the month of March. Soups, salads, and sundaes were served to eight of the staff as they gathered together for fellowship and lunch in Bethany Hall on Tuesday, March 18. Pastor Derrick Gutierrez as their supervisor expressed words of appreciation and led in prayer, while Ginny Brown as Lead Team Chairperson shared Scripture and thoughts of appreciation on behalf of the congregation. For a time of fellowship Lois Neidermyer led the group in a challenging two-team game of pictionary, based on two topics: church items or locations and Biblical events.

During the luncheon, years of service of staff members were highlighted, noting Custodian Kevin Fritz as the longest serving staff member going on 25 consecutive years and Administrative Nicole Migliore as the newest staff member, being hired just a year and a half ago. Worship Survey and Task Force Follow-Up


Thank you to the Covenant Church members who completed the worship follow-up survey in January of this year. Your input is so valued in helping to direct further considerations for Sunday morning worship. The results from the 15 surveys returned have been fully compiled and handed over to Pastor Derrick, who is sharing them with the Worship Team and then will do so with the congregation after the Easter season.

The work of the Worship Task Force, which was established by the Pathways Team, has concluded one year from its first meeting in February of 2024. Thank you to the Task Force members—Pastor Derrick Gutierrez, Asher Hadgu, Linda Henning, Sandy Leonard, Barry Miller, Bonnie Miller, Lois Neidermyer, and Laura Rappoldt for their investment of time, effort, and prayer. They researched, they brainstormed, they surveyed, they deliberated, and they prayed in order to redesign the worship service with the goal of meeting a variety of congregants' worship preferences while also appealing to prospective new members. Now after experiencing the new blended worship format and receiving feedback with the follow-up survey, the Worship Team will resume its responsibility for any changes in the worship service.

Under the direction of Pastor Gutierrez and the leadership of Chairperson Darwin Tyson, the Worship Team has been studying the book "Both And" by Jason Moore to consider ways to make our online worship more meaningful and effective. So further updates to the worship service will be focused on both in-person worship and online worship. Do keep the Worship Team in your prayers. In addition to Pastor Derrick and Chairperson Darwin, the Worship Team is composed of Dave Beznoska. Ginny Brown, Cindy Hean, and Larry Rappoldt.


UWF RETREAT 2025

EPA Conference to Address Regionalization

The Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church will convene from May 20 to 22, 2025, at the Wildwood Convention Center in New Jersey with the theme "PRAISE!" This is the second year for the EPA Annual Conference to meet in this location immediately following the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference as the same bishop oversees both conferences. In her first year assigned to this position, Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi will preside over the holy conferencing.

Delegates from Covenant Church will include the Rev. Derrick Gutierrez as Senior Pastor, the Rev. Sally Ott as an officially retired pastor, and Lois Neidermyer as Lay Member to Annual Conference. Pastor Derrick will leave for Annual Conference late Sunday, May 18, and thus be out of the church office though the rest of that week. He will be back for the weekend and worship service on Sunday, May 25.

One of the key items of business at Annual Conference will be the discussion and vote on ratification of the constitutional amendments passed by the General Conference regarding regionalization of the world-wide United Methodist Church. Nine regional conferences with some autonomy for their areas would be recognized, and the United States would now be one. If you have questions or input, do not hesitate to direct them to Covenant's delegates.



WHAT CAN'T REGIONAL CONFERENCES DO?

- Create their own constitution or adopt any policy in violation of the constitution contained in the General Book of Discipline
- Alter The Doctrinal Standards, Our Theological Task,
 The Ministry of All Christians or The Social Principles



WHAT CAN REGIONAL CONFERENCES DO?

- Draft and publish their own regional Book of Discipline, hymnals, books of worship and other liturgical resources
- Set requirements for ordination and licensed ministry with respect to their needs and resources
- · Set standards for lay membership
- Develop practices around marriage ceremonies, funerals and other rites that align with cultural contexts and laws in each country
- Reorganize their annual conferences, districts or charge conferences to best serve their missional needs and convene their own judicial courts
- Work with annual conferences to ensure policies and practices align with the laws in each country




WHAT IS REGIONALIZATION?

- Regionalization allows each region of the church to make decisions
 that will best support outreach and ministry efforts in their specific setting.
 This ability is already in place in the central conferences; regionalization
 will bring that ability to the U.S. as well.
- Regionalization was developed collaboratively by United Methodists across the globe.
- . It was adopted by an overwhelming majority of General Conference delegates.
- Nine regional conferences will comprise The UMC: one in the U.S. and eight in Africa, Europe and the Philippines.



WHAT NOW?

- The regionalization plan will require amending the United Methodist Constitution. Constitutional amendments
 must be passed by at least 2/3 of General Conference, which already happened.
- Now, the amendments must be ratified by annual conferences. Amendments must be supported by 2/3
 of the total voting members of all the annual conferences combined this process could last until 2026.
- . The Council of Bishops will announce when the amendments have met the threshold to become church law.
