Pathways Progress



PATHWAYS

Since the first Pathways meeting in August, Covenant's pastors and members in leadership posi-

tions have met four more times with District Superintendent Jenny Freymoyer, following the steps of the EPA Conference's Pathways process. As we focused on the Pathway of Sustainability for Growth, we carefully examined the statistics and status of Covenant Church, noting our challenges with worship attendance, with the need for more lay people in leader-ship, with an unbalanced budget, and with the financial demands of an older facility. We explored our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats to assess where Covenant Church is right now. We also reviewed our mission statement (We Invite, We Welcome, We Nurture, We Serve), identified Scriptures that support our mission, and evaluated how we are doing in fulfilling each aspect of our mission. Under the direction of D.S. Jenny, we then delved into identifying what we would want in a church if we were new to an area. Consequently, work has already begun on updating and eventually rebuilding our website. However, that is only one step in moving forward. From all that we have explored and discussed, we are coming closer to determining the direction of the path forward for Covenant.

Our choice of a specific focus will come from consideration of the following features or markers of a vital church: inspiring worship, small-group fellowship and learning, hands-on mission, cultivation of new disciples, and generous giving. While Covenant Church has certainly been engaged in all of these aspects with varying intensity through the years, the question is which one should be our focus at this time for moving forward. Early in the new year, we will make that determination in order to diligently pursue church sustainability and growth.

In 2024 Covenant Church will celebrate our 140th anniversary, a time to thank God for the past and its legacy and a time to listen to God for direction for the years ahead for His glory and the advancement of His kingdom. As Pastor Derrick Gutierrez shared with us in his sermon on the Sunday between Thanksgiving and Advent, all of us who care about Covenant Church and its future should join in earnest prayer for God's direction. Pray for God to make clear the path for Covenant UM Church to fulfill its mission and to be God's light for our community and beyond. Pray that He will enable each of us to give of ourselves and to support one another in walking that path together.

Sunday School

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Beginning in December, the Faith Walk Class will explore An Unlikely Advent with Rachel Billups, who presents insights into various Scriptures about the first Christmas. There is always more to learn from the Christmas story, which never grows old and offers new opportunities to deepen our faith. The class will begin the new year with a study from one of their favorite authors, Max Lucado. His new book and DVD presentations, God Never Gives Up on You, focus on Jacob of the Old Testament. Teachers Carole Horn, Chris Kimmich, Lois Neidermyer, and Cindy Smith take turns leading the class discussions.



Bible2School is Expanding

Bible2School is growing both locally and nationally. That means more and more public elementary school children are learning from the Bible during their school day through this weekly released-time program. Originally beginning in Manheim, PA, this program has expanded throughout Lancaster County and into Lebanon County as well as to the Johnstown area and soon to Philadelphia. As of the beginning of November, 1,875 children had been enrolled for this school year, a figure greater than last year. That number will certainly grow in the new year with Bible2School classes opening beyond our state borders in Idaho and Tennessee.

Covenant UM Church is also seeing an increase in the number of students from Fulton Elementary School participating in Bible2School. With the recruitment of additional adult volunteers from the area, a class for third graders has just opened at our church on Thursdays along with the established classes for fourth graders the same day and second graders on Tuesdays. The adult volunteers walk them from the school to our downstairs youth room and teach them from the Bible as they eat their lunches there. Second graders focus on the Old Testament, third graders on the New Testament, and fourth graders on discipleship. All grades are introduced to Jesus as God's Son and how He can be their Lord and Savior.

Bible2School is also piloting a new curriculum for fifth and sixth graders within our county and in western Pennsylvania with hopes of expanding the availability of the program to the next grade levels. Praise the Lord for children who are being introduced for the first time to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit through this program and for those who are growing in their understanding of the Bible.

If you want to know more about Bible2School, please talk with Cindy Hean, who volunteers at Covenant with the Fulton second graders, or to Lois Neidermyer, who also teaches second graders here and who serves on the Bible2School Curriculum Committee.

United Women in Faith Reading Program

We are THANKFUL for you support.


