## From the Pastor's Desk...

As we begin the season of Advent, we prepare our hearts once again for the coming of Christ by remembering his birth in Bethlehem and watching eagerly for his return in glory. This

year, our Advent worship will focus on how God reveals himself through signs that guide us toward hope, peace, joy, and love.

The theme of our Advent Sundays is "Signs"—those moments when God breaks into our normal world and invites us to see with fresh eyes. From ancient prophecies to angelic announcements, from John the Baptist's wilderness preaching to a young carpenter's obedient faith, God has consistently used signs lead and reveal his purposes.

Our journey begins on November 30 with "Signs and Time," as we explore Jesus' words about watchfulness and hope. We live in the times between Christ's first coming and his promised return, and God gives us signs of his faithfulness to sustain us in the waiting.

On December 7, we'll gather at the communion table to hear "Signs and Stories." John the Baptist's call to repentance reminds us that God is in the business of rewriting our stories, transforming our conflicts into his peace.

December 14 guides us to "Signs and Truth," where we learn with John the Baptist that even in our questions and doubts, we can rejoice in Christ's mission in the world. Joy doesn't need perfect certainty because it grows from recognizing what God is doing.

As Christmas approaches, December 21 highlights "Signs and Faithfulness." Through Joseph's story, we'll see how God's love calls us to remain faithful even when circumstances are challenging, and the road ahead is uncertain.

Our celebration continues on Christmas Eve with "Signs and Glory," as we marvel at how God's greatest glory arrived in the most unexpected way—a baby in a manger, angels singing to shepherds, the infinite entering the finite. The sign that changed everything came wrapped in swaddling clothes.

On December 28, we will conclude our Advent season with a special Music Sunday, lifting our voices in Christmas carols that have shared the good news across generations.

## **Covenant's Casavant Organ Turns 100**



The Casavant pipe organ at Covenant United Methodist Church in Lancaster will be 100 years old in 2026. You are invited to be a part of the 100th anniversary celebration, which will culminate with an organ recital and hymn sing, featuring acclaimed concert organist, Gordon Turk, on October 25, 2026.

This instrument was built in 1926 by the Casavant Freres pipe organ company of St. Hyacinth, Quebec, Canada. The Covenant organ of 1926 exemplifies many of the tonal and mechanical characteristics of the French Romantic style of organ building and is the only instrument of this style and historical significance Still operating in Pennsylvania. However, repairs are necessary to prepare for our 100th anniversary celebration concert.

We are initiating a capital campaign now to raise \$100,000 for work on this historic organ over the next year. This is a significant beginning, with more funds to be raised in the following years for further restoration. You have an opportunity to be a part of this project by contributing to the Covenant Casavant Organ Fund. Check your mail for a letter that details how you can contribute.

## **Bible2School Expanding**

In September of this year Kori Pennypacker, the CEO of Bible2School, was interviewed by Jim Daly on the radio broadcast of Focus on the Family. With this broadcast heard throughout the nation, the response has been very encouraging with 28 new inquiries about the program across 15 different states. At present time Bible2School is mostly at work within Pennsylvania, although three other states are also currently involved. Curriculum is available for second, third, and fourth grades along with the new fifth grade curriculum being used this year. A curriculum for sixth grade is in the works and should be published in time for the next school year.

Kori explains simply why children should be taught the Bible: (1) so children can know the truth from God's Word and recognize counterfeits, (2) so children can live their lives in a relationship with Jesus, and (3) so children can know how to have eternal life. Covenant Church is actively involved in doing so with second, third, and fourth graders from Fulton Elementary School. Please pray for these young children and those who teach them.

## **Sunday School Class Offerings**

Do you want to learn more about and from the Bible? Would you like help with how to live your life as a Christian in today's world? Then come to a Sunday School class from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. after the 8:00 a.m. bilingual worship service or before the 10:30 a.m. worship service.

The Sonshine Class meets downstairs in Room B1 right off the elevator. They are exploring the Bible a book at a time. As 2025 is coming to a close, they are studying Daniel, Jonah, and Malachi from the Old Testament. Then as the new year comes, their studies will turn to the New Testament, starting with John, Luke, and Matthew.

The Faith Walk Class meets in the Chapel Library and uses DVD studies along with Scripture references and class discussion. As Advent begins, so does their study of The Marvel and Miracle of Advent as presented by Christine Caine and Lisa Harper. These same two DVD teachers were well received at the last United Women in Faith retreat with their study on Easter. No matter how familiar you are with the Christmas story, there is always more to learn about what led up to the birth of Christ and what impact His birth had then and has now. With the start of the new year the class will engage in one of Max Lucado's recent DVD studies: You Are Never Alone: Trust in the Miracle of God's Presence and Power.

Mr. Kevin, we love you, for all you've done and all you do."


After a lunch provided by Lead Team members, Kevin was presented with a "Man of God" blanket throw and a framed certificate recognizing his 25 years as Custodian.

## **Update from the Lead Team**

Under our 2025 leadership model, the Lead Team includes church members from various ministries and committees. It also functions as the Trustees, Finance Committee, and SPRC Committee. We combined all the administrative committees into one group to reduce meetings and focus more on ministry.

The committee meets every two months, starting in January on the 3rd Tuesday at 7pm. Here is an update from the November meeting:

- On November 18th, the church had its official Charge Conference. The Charge
  conference is the official business meeting of the church. We discussed the lead team
  for 2026, the pastor provided a report for the work completed in 2025, and the various
  reports were submitted to the Annual Conference and approved. Rev. Jeff Kapp
  presided over our charge conference.
- Covenant is part of the Lancaster City Mission Link. The mission link is a collaboration among the UM churches. We are planning a joint service for Good Friday, April 3, 2026.
- The Child Care center recently held a parent appreciation event, offering coffee, donuts, and assorted baked goods as parents dropped off their children in the morning. We thank the families who choose Covenant Child Care to nurture their children.
- The church has a new phone system installed by Comcast.
- The Nurture team will be joining Fulton Elementary School PTO for their annual Christmas Gingerbread house event on Saturday, December 6th.
- A committee has been established to organize the celebration for the 100th anniversary
  of the Casavant Organ in 2026. The church is initiating a capital campaign to raise
  \$100,000 to begin the organ restoration in time for the celebration.
- The 2026 Budget is completed and approved.
- Community Fellowship church has completed the renovations of the Chestnut Hill building at the corner of N Charlotte and W Chestnut streets. On Sunday mornings, Community Fellowship will be using some of the parking spots in our lot.
