Many people love to get away during the summer months.. As summer draws to a close and the colors of fall begin to emerge, I am drawn to the quiet, healing presence of the woods. I have

the opportunity in late October to step away from the noise of daily life and spend time in the wilderness on a silent retreat—a time of fasting, praying, listening, and seeking God's vision for our church.

As we move forward together, I invite each of you to create your own moments of stillness, whether through a walk in nature, a time of fasting, or simply setting aside quiet moments in prayer. Ask God to reveal the vision for your life, for your family, and for our church. Let's commit to being a people who listen well and follow faithfully.

We are entering a season where God is preparing to do something new among us. I truly believe that as we seek God together, we will discern a shared vision that will guide us into the future He has prepared for us. I look forward to walking this journey with you, trusting in the One who makes all things new.

Here's to Good Health!

The lazy days of summer are gone, and the busy time of fall and winter loom ahead. Routines change and we become busier. Sleep is important to keep us going. How often do you get a good night's sleep? Why is sleep important? What can you do to have a better sleep each night?

What is sleep? It is the natural periodic suspension of consciousness during which the powers of the body are restored. For an adult that time for sleeping is 6-9 hours each night.

Insomnia is having chronic trouble falling asleep, staying asleep, or waking up too early. These problems last for months or longer. These people have trouble functioning during the day. So, as we get older it is reported that we get less deep sleep. That is REM sleep, the rapid eye movement sleep stage when we dream --more awakenings, more light sleep, and more fragmented sleep. This can happen between the ages of 50 to 60 years old.

Talk with your PCP about any medications you might use to help with your sleep. There are a few things you can do to help aid in getting that good night's sleep. Let me share some sleep hygiene tips.

- Avoid caffeine. It takes 8 hours to wear off.
- Limit alcohol.
- Avoid bright lights, the phone, computer, and the TV for an hour before bed.
- Reduce noise. Use white noise machines or a fan for smoothing sounds.
- Keep a routine. A pre- bedtime routine helps the brain recognize that it's time to go to sleep.
- Avoid naps after 3p.m.
- Avoid big meals late at night.
- Keep the bedroom cool.

Do you want to learn more from the Bible? Do you want to explore what the Bible says about how to live your life today? Then come to Sunday School. There are two adults classes from which to choose.

Every Sunday at 9:00 A.M. the Sonshine Class meets in Room B1 on the lower level next to the elevator, and the Faith Walk Class gathers in the Chapel/Library. All are welcome!

The Sonshine Class is currently studying "Loving the Jesus Way," based on I Corinthians 13. Following that study, they will return to watching the ministry of Jesus through the eyes of his followers in "The Chosen, Season 3." Ginny Brown and Patti Willard lead the class in their studies and discussions.

The Faith Walk Class is concluding their series of lessons from "On Purpose: Finding God's Voice in Your Passion," as presented on DVD by four different United Methodist pastors. Their next study, which will continue throughout October and November, is entitled "How (Not) to Read the Bible." Dr. Dan Kimball, a graduate of and professor at Western Seminary, will present via DVD an approach to make sense of various misunderstood and difficult Bible passages.

Discussion of the DVD presentations and further search of the Scriptures are led on a rotating basis by teachers Carole Horn, Chris Kimmich, Lois Neidermyer, and Cindy Smith. Come learn what the Bible teaches!



Bible2School Begins 5th Year at Fulton

For the 2024-2025 school year Covenant Church is hosting once again Bible2School, a released time religious education program, for Fulton Elementary School. Sessions start at the end of September and beginning of October. Second graders will come on Mondays and fourth graders on Tuesdays over their lunch and recess hours. Once enough adult volunteers are available, third graders will be able to participate in the program on Tuesdays also. Julie Pack is the site director for classes for Fulton Elementary and also for Lafayette Elementary, which begins its first year with Bible2School this school year.

Cindy Hean and Lois Neidermyer will work along side Julie to teach the Old Testament curriculum to the second graders. Third graders study the New Testament and fourth graders Christian Discipleship. Please notify the church office if you or someone you know could volunteer two hours over the noon hour on Tuesdays to make Bible2School possible for Fulton third graders this year.

The Bible2School outreach continues to grow. During the 2023-2024 school year there were 45 elementary schools with a total of 108 classes and 2,375 students involved in the program. Over half of those children, 53%, did not attend church on a regular basis. This January the program expanded beyond Pennsylvania with schools in Idaho and Tennessee. Schools in additional states are showing interest. Please pray for children in Lancaster County and across our nation to learn to know the Bible and Jesus as Savior this school year.
