Prayer Shawl has made thousands of shawls since they began, but they've also expanded beyond their namesake shawls. They make lap blankets for seniors and chemo patients, caps and scarves for kindergarteners and the homeless, cot blankets and more. This year they're adopting residents at the Barrington who have no one to visit them. Prayer Shawl will make lap robes, shawls, caps, scarves and more for these residents.
