

Who Do You Think Jesus Is? January 19, 2025 | Matthew 5:17-20 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

** Before you begin, please read Matthew 5:17-20.

- 1. Ice-breaker: Imagine you asked 6-8 random individuals on the street who Jesus is. What responses do you think you'd get?
- 2. Why is it important to learn as much as we can about who Jesus is, as revealed in the Bible? (Or think of this way: What's at stake with this question, "Who do you think Jesus is?")
- 3. What do you learn about Jesus in Matthew 5:17-20 that is new to you, or that may be overlooked in popular conceptions of Jesus' identity?
- 4. What does it mean that Jesus came to "fulfill the Law" (v. 17) and why is this significant?
- 5. Read the following passages, then share how they add to or reinforce the truth that the Old Testament points forward to Jesus Christ.
 - Luke 24:27
 - John 5:39
- 6. How does the truth that Jesus came to fulfill the Law help you understand the relationship between the Old Testament and the New Testament?
- 7. Re-read Matthew 5:19-20. What are your knee jerk reactions to what Jesus says here?
- 8. Read Romans 8:3-4 and 2 Corinthians 5:21. Based on these verses, how can we "surpass the righteousness of the Pharisees and teachers of the law" and "enter the kingdom of heaven"?
- 9. How can seeing Christ as our Substitute motivate our desire to follow Him in every area of our lives?
- 10. How does what you've learned about Jesus in this passage affect what following Him faithfully looks like, practically speaking?
- 11. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible today?
- 12. What was your biggest take-away from the message? Why?
- 13. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
- 14. **Challenge:** Memorize 2 Corinthians 5:21: God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
