

The "How?" and "Why?" of Prayer March 23, 2025 | Matthew 7:7-12 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

** Before you begin, please read Matthew 7:7-12.

- 1. Ice-breaker: Does prayer come easily to you or not? Explain your answer.
- 2. How does the way we view prayer influence our approach to it? In your own words, why would you say prayer is important?
- 3. Re-read Matthew 7:7-8 and Matthew 6:9-13. How does Matthew 6:9-13 give you a "head start" on what to ask for?
- 4. Asking, seeking, and knocking are simple actions anyone can take reminding us of the value of "simple prayer." What are some examples of "simple prayer" that come to your mind?
- 5. Do you tend to overcomplicate prayer, or keep it simple? Explain.
- 6. These verses say that "ask and it will be given to you, . . . knock and the door will be opened to you." Does this mean God will answer every prayer, exactly the way we ask it? Explain your response.
- 7. Make a short list of observations about the God we pray to, from Matthew 7:9-11.
- 8. How do these truths about God reinforce trust in God that we can trust what He puts in front of us?
- 9. What other truths about God (who He is and what He's done) build further trust in Him? Tie your answers to specific Scriptures as best as you can.
- 10. What is one way you've learned to trust God, even in the midst of prayers that didn't get answered the way you were asking?
- 11. What is one practical step you can take to live in light of what you've learned from Matthew 7:7-12?
- 12. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible today?
- 13. What was your biggest take-away from the message? Why?
- 14. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
