

God's Faithfulness June 15, 2025 | Genesis 15:1-21 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

** Before you begin, please read Genesis 15:1-21 as a group. **

- 1. Icebreaker: Why is a person's view of God so important?
- 2. What do you learn about God in Genesis 15:1? What are your take-aways from this?
- 3. Re-read verses 2 and 3. From these verses, what is consuming Abram's attention early in chapter 15?
- 4. What does the Lord say in response to this concern of Abram's? (See verses 1, 4-5.)
- 5. What does God's response reveal about how He interacts with humans?
- 6. Focus on Genesis 15:6 with the following questions:
 - How does Abram respond to God's promise in Genesis 15:5? Use language straight from the passage in your answer.
 - What does the Lord in turn give to Abram (what is "credited" to Abram)? Again, use language straight from the passage in your answer.
 - Read the following New Testament passages that refer specifically to Genesis 15:6: Romans 4:1-8; Galatians 3:1-9. What point are these New Testament passages driving home?
- 7. In the remaining verses in Genesis 15, God confirms His covenant with Abram. How does this passage show God's commitment to follow through on His promises?
- 8. Genesis 15 drives home both God's committed faithfulness to His promises and our response of faith in Him. Reflect on these same truths in light of Jesus' Person and work on the cross:
 - How does the Person and work of Jesus demonstrate God's faithfulness to His promises? (Hint: See Romans 8:31-32; Galatians 3:13-14.)
 - Why is faith in Jesus Christ alone so important? (Hint: See Ephesians 2:8-9; also Romans 4:1-8 and Galatians 3:1-11.)
- 9. What is a practical step of application you can take, in light of what you've learned today from this passage?
- 10. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible today?
- 11. What was your biggest take-away from the message? Why?
- 12. **Challenge:** Memorize Genesis 15:6 Abraham believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness.
