Questions for Study and Group Discussion

*** Before you begin, please read Psalm 27:1-14 as a group.*

1. Icebreaker: We'll be spending the next five weeks looking at individual psalms. What excites you about spending time in the psalms? What questions do you have about this book of the Bible?
2. How does Psalm 27 present the reality of crisis? Make a list of specific words, phrases, and concepts in the psalm that underscore the struggle the psalmist is facing.
3. Why is it important to understand that the Bible doesn't have a naïve understanding of the difficulties we can face?
4. As a group, work to identify 6-8 truths about God's character from Psalm 27:1-14.
5. Choose one of these truths from the previous question to focus on. How can this truth about God's character instill confidence in you?
6. Re-read Psalm 27:4 and Psalm 27:8. In your own words, summarize what these verses are driving at. Why is it important to keep the message of these verses in mind?
7. Focus on Psalm 27:13-14. What does it mean to "wait for the Lord," practically speaking?
8. What is one area of life in which you need to apply this command to "wait for the Lord"? Get specific: What will it look like in your life to "wait for the Lord" in this area?
9. Practically speaking, what can you do to apply something you read from this passage or heard in the sermon?
10. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible today?
11. What was your biggest take-away from the message? Why?
12. Challenge: Memorize Psalm 27:8: "My heart says of you, 'Seek his face!' Your face, Lord, I will seek."
