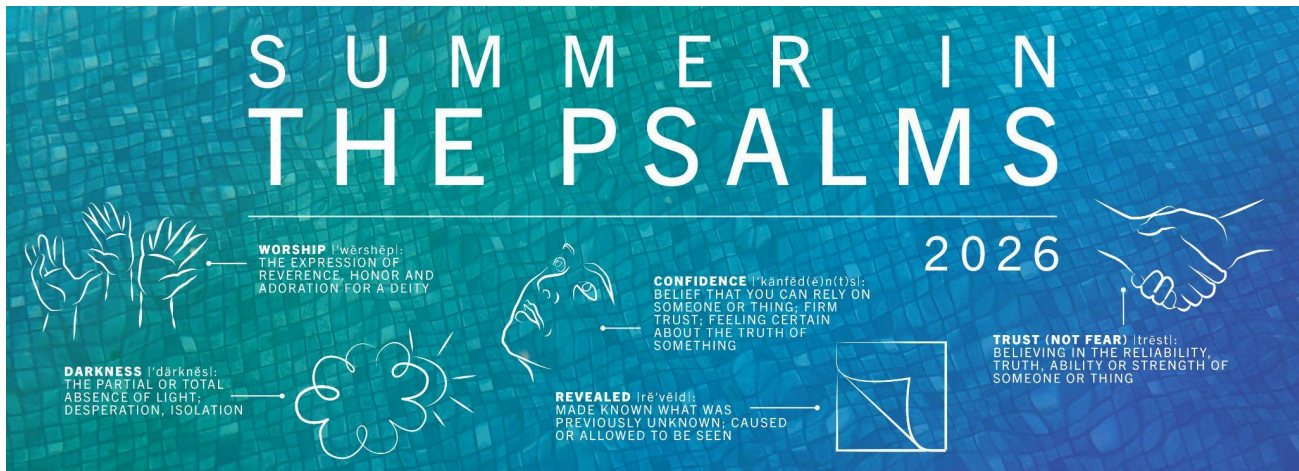




Worship

Questions for Study and Group Discussion

*** Before you begin, please read Psalm 95:1-11 as a group*

1. Icebreaker: Share about an experience you've had recently where you've naturally overflowed in appreciation for something (e.g. a movie you saw you can't stop talking about, a restaurant you're recommending to others, etc.).
2. What are common stereotypes or word associations people have with the word "worship"?
3. The definition for worship given in the messages was this: "Worship is responding rightly to the greatness of God." How does this definition provide a bigger view of worship than is often thought of?
4. Review Psalm 95. What do you learn about the character of God that motivates a response of worship?
5. Make a list of the different physical responses of worship in Psalm 95. Why is it important for physical expression and the posture of our hearts to be connected?
6. Read Psalm 95:8-10. How does this passage teach that listening to God with soft hearts is an important expression of worship?
7. Practically speaking, what can you do to apply something you read from this passage or heard in the sermon?
8. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible today?
9. What was your biggest take-away from the message? Why?
10. **Challenge:** Memorize Psalm 95:6-7: "Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker; for he is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care."
