Lessons on Faith: Romans 4:1-25

Questions for Study and Group Discussion

*** Before you begin, please read Romans Romans 4:1-25 as a group*

1. Icebreaker: Describe someone you know who stands out for their faith in God. Why do you describe them this way?
2. Define faith. (Hint: See Hebrews 11:1.) Why is faith in Jesus so important?
3. Why does Paul focus on Abraham in Romans 4? What point is he trying to make?
4. In his message, Jeff highlighted “5 Lessons About Faith” (included below). Which of these lessons stood out to you the most, and why?
 - Faith doesn’t depend on our performance.
 - Faith doesn’t depend on our religious credentials.
 - Faith depends on God’s promise.
 - Faith is confident in God’s ability—even when circumstances say otherwise.
 - Faith ultimately points us to resurrection power.
5. Read Hebrews 11:8-19. What does this passage reinforce or add to your understanding of faith from the life of Abraham?
6. Based on what you’ve learned about faith in Romans 4:1-25, how might your life look different this week?
7. What other questions or comments do you have about what you looked at in the Bible today?
8. **Challenge** — Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you’re learning this coming week?
9. **Challenge** — Memorize Romans 4:20-21: “20 Yet [Abraham] did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, 21 being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised.
