Dear Selwyn Members and Friends,

We are standing on the edge of Easter! In John's version of the <u>narrative</u>, it is still dark outside as Mary approaches Jesus' tomb early that morning. Peter and the other disciple would have been racing by the feel of their feet as they hit the ground. Moving through the unknown requires a bit of confidence and loads of trust. They say it's always darkest just before the dawn, but that's not true.

Standing on the edge of Easter, things come into focus as the sun breaks through the horizon. What is true is that Holy Week reveals as much about humanity as Easter Morning reveals about God. In fact, the events of Jesus' betrayal and murder are far more predictable and easier to understand. Are they not? However, the Church, by God's design, is called to order our lives according to the resurrection. Like Mary, Peter, and the other disciple, as long as we are pursuing Christ, we will not be forsaken. Even if we aren't yet sure of what we will encounter along the way, we can (and should) move through the unknown toward the living Christ.

As we stand on the edge of Easter, I give thanks for your faithful presence at Selwyn Avenue. You, yes you, are essential to our narrative and the way we share the Gospel within and beyond our walls. There is so much to celebrate this Spring! As the beloved hymn so aptly states, our *hearts unfold like flowers before* the One who's grace has blessed our community. Last month, the fellowship hall was packed with members for Selwyn's annual congregational meeting. Also, an update on SAPC's vision for the future and an invitation from Quail Hollow Presbyterian Church to consider a merger were shared. Many good points and important questions were raised by members like you! Since then, the Planning Team continues to meet with interested members as often as possible, a joint Session retreat between SAPC and QHPC was led by Dr. Tim Conder of Black Mountain School of Theology, and Selwyn's Session voted unanimously to grant the planning team permission to further research the opportunity with QHPC.

Understanding QHPC's invitation presents Selwyn with great possibilities, we still have more questions than answers. SAPC's Session cannot and should not make an decision without first fully examining and exploring the potential benefits and risks Selwyn would encounter.

Over the next six months, SAPC's Planning Team will organize several smaller teams for the purpose of discovery. By praying, listening, researching, and acting together, we hope a clear path will be revealed. Findings will be shared along the way, and the Thriving Congregation's team will continue to serve as trained leaders and guides in our mutual discernment. The process of research will explore the feasibility of a shared vision, identity, finances, assets, barriers, staffing, organization, land use at QHPC and more. Only then, will our Sessions and congregations be informed enough to vote this fall.

If this seems excited or scary (or both), I wholeheartedly agree! As we all know, these feelings bubble up every time God is calling us toward a new thing. However, this sense of wonder and hope should be affirmed by careful planning, due diligence, and prayerful consideration. The Planning Team will share a process of discernment soon. You will be invited to share your ideas, expertise, and feedback along the way. Right now, we are standing on the edge of Easter. Remember the invitation from QHPC was extended in good faith. SAPC has received it in the same spirit of Christian unity. We are discerning God's call for SAPC and QHPC from a position of abundant gratitude. I give thanks to God for the new, life-giving relationships we have formed between our congregations. The Planning Team has cultivated a culture of openness and mutual discernment, and the Session invites your engagement through a faithful sharing of ideas, trust and prayers.


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND FORMATION
