As we turn to the final weeks of summer, SAPC has been busy planning for another year of faith formation for infants and children through fifth grade. We fulfill our baptismal vows each Sunday mornings by nurturing our children through love, care and fun!

Sunday Mornings and Evenings:

Sunday School- 9:30am (*four-year-olds to fifth grade*) - At Selwyn, a child's faith formation is marked by appropriate milestones along the way. Children not participating in a specific milestone class are invited to discover a new story each week through stations that include a book corner, prayer table, story time, crafts and building. Every Sunday at 9:30am children are invited to engage stories about God's love through intentional, planned lessons and Montessori style learning.

Milestone, Worship Readiness 1.0 (*five-year-olds to second grade*) - Non-readers and early readers listen to Bible stories, tour the sanctuary, and answer big questions about worship! Why and how do we worship? What is baptism and communion? This class is designed to help children participate and enjoy worship. WR 1.0 classes gather in the Bowman building at 9:30am for five weeks (9/8-10/6). This milestone will be celebrated on October 6th as children and their parents celebrate the Lord's Supper in worship.

Milestone, How to Use Your Bible *(third to fifth grades)* - How do we find the stories we love or look up scripture? What are the major themes and stories of God and God's people? Who wrote the Bible? How is it organized? Why does the Bible matter? Classes meet in the Bowman building at 9:30am for five weeks (10/20- 11/17). This milestone will be celebrated in worship as children will be recognized for completing the class, and those who have not yet received a Bible will do so November 17th.

Milestone, Worship Readiness 2.0 (*second and third grades*) - Readers, deepen their understanding of worship by exploring essential scriptures, creeds, and prayer like the Lord's Prayer and the Apostles' Creed. Children learn the elements of worship and how to use a hymnal with confidence. WR 2.0 classes are held in the Spring of each year, dates TBD. This milestone will be celebrated in worship as learners explore various ways they can lead in worship.

Tween Bible Study *(third to fifth grades)* - An intentional time of learning and community building for our oldest children, tweens will gather Sunday evenings this fall at 5:30pm for dinner and study. This fall, learners will explore the book of Acts. Gathering dates are 9/15, 9/22, 10/20, 10/27, and 11/17.

Children in Worship:

Nursery Care (for infants to three-years old) - At this stage, your children need love and care, and you need to know they are safe and happy. While children are always welcomed in worship, experienced nursery caregivers welcome our youngest members between 9:15am and 11:45am each Sunday in two rooms (Crib/Toddlers and Three/Fours).

Four-years olds - In this transitional year, your child is encouraged to attend worship and Children's Chapel. Age-appropriate worship bags await them each week in the Narthex as they begin practicing worship and coming forward for the children's message. During the sermon, Children's Chapel is offered for fours through second grade children. This time includes a Bible story, snack, arts, games, and/or free play. Children return to the sanctuary before worship ends.

Elementary Aged Children - Children's Chapel is designed for children, fours through second grade. Although it takes practice, children who worship are more likely to become adults who worship. Selwyn celebrates wiggles and welcomes whispers in worship. Each week, worship bags (reader and non-reader bags) await your child in the narthex. These bags are prepared as tools to help guide your children during worship.

Children's Choir (*four-years old and up*) - SAPC's children's choir is co-led by Fred Spano and Nancy Nutter. The choir practices on Wednesday evenings from 5:30-6pm in the Chapel. Fall practice dates are 9/25, 10/2, 10/9, 10/16, and 12/4 and 12/11. The choir will sing in worship on Sunday, October 20th, and on December 15th as part of the Christmas pageant.

Children's Christmas Pageant (all children 3 years old and up) - Children lead worship and tell the Christmas story in this special Selwyn tradition. Practices will be Saturdays, December 7th and 14th at 10am. The pageant is Sunday, December 15th in worship, with the annual all church Christmas luncheon to follow.


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND FORMATION
