Dear Beloved Members of Selwyn Avenue and Quail Hollow Presbyterian Churches,

As we stand on the threshold of becoming one church with two campuses, we give thanks for the journey that has brought us to this moment. Through prayer, reflection, and faithful conversation, we have sought to listen for God's voice, discerning the path that will lead us into a shared future as one united body of Christ.

Most recently, our merger was officially affirmed by the Presbytery of Charlotte, and now our two congregations can proceed toward the final steps of a civil merger. So, what's next? Later this month elders from both congregations will gather for the first time as one Session. Together we will give thanks and pray, then each Session will complete the legal steps required for an official merger. Finally, the combined Session will consider a new set of by-laws and a slate of elders representing members on both campuses.

Our Reformed tradition reminds us God's providence is ever at work—guiding, sustaining, and calling us forward. Reformer, John Calvin, spoke of God's sovereignty not as a distant force but as an intimate assurance that, in all things, God's hand is leading us. Even in seasons of change, we trust God is at work, bringing about renewal and transformation in ways beyond our understanding. As we prepare to step into this new chapter together, we do so with faith, courage, and trust, knowing that "the Lord is faithful in all His words and kind in all His works" (Psalm 145:13).

Therefore, on **Sunday, March 2nd at 10:30am**, we will gather on the Selwyn campus as our youth lead us in combined worship. Immediately afterward, you are invited to a very important congregational meeting in the Fellowship Hall. Together, we will enjoy a light lunch while hearing updates from our elders and voting to affirm our new by-laws. As one congregation, Quail Hollow will officially become a campus of Selwyn Avenue Presbyterian Church. Our first official act will be to elect a new class of elders representing both campuses.

Throughout scripture, God's people are called to bold steps of faith. Abraham was called to journey to an unknown land (Genesis 12:1), Moses led the Israelites forward with the assurance God would go before them (Exodus 33:14), and the early church was formed through the power of the Holy Spirit, binding diverse communities into one body (Ephesians 4:4-6). Likewise, guided by our North Star Vision we are called into a future not yet fully seen, but one we trust is shaped by God's grace and faithfulness. As we move ahead, our leaders will create opportunities for intentional togetherness through worship, mission, study and fellowship. Furthermore, the Planning Committee will continue to advise and guide our Session as we build up the body of Christ and pursue our North Star Vision. As the prophet Isaiah reminds us:

"Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs forth; do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:18-19)

With deep gratitude for the past and eager expectation for what lies ahead, let us move forward together—united in Christ, strengthened by faith, and confident in the promise that wherever God calls, God also provides. May we embrace this journey with joy, knowing we do not walk alone, but with one another and with the Spirit who leads us ever onward.





Lent, the 40-day liturgical season leading to Easter, is a time of repentance, self-examination, and spiritual renewal. Lent invites believers to reflect on their need for God's grace, acknowledging sin and seeking transformation.

Greg Jarrell's, Our Trespasses provides a compelling lens for understanding the communal and systemic nature of sin, emphasizing how broken relationships—personal and societal—call for reconciliation. His exploration of sin as something woven into the fabric of our shared lives aligns with Lent's call to repentance, not just as individual confession but as a reorientation toward justice and healing in the world. 'Greg's book uncovers how race, geography, policy and religion have created haunted landscapes in Charlotte, callings us to consider how we value our lands, livelihoods, and communities.' You are invited to purchase the book online or pick one up at the church office for \$20.

Whether attending worship, serving alongside our mission partners, committing to a Lenten Bible study on the themes of sin and grace, reading and discussing Jarrell's book, you are invited to join us on a journey toward Easter resurrection.

CHILDREN'S CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND FORMATION DURING THE LENTEN SEASON

Sunday Mornings

- Our youngest children (0-3) are greeted by four experienced caregivers in the nursery. Volunteers read stories with the children and sing. There are snacks provided and time to go out on the playground.
- Children four years and older gather at 9:30am in the Bowman Building to learn. Using the PCUSA curriculum, Follow Me, Practice Spiritual Disciplines, we will explore prayer, service and Bible study, allowing us to draw closer to God.
- Worship Readiness 2.0 for 2nd 4th grades will meet March 9 30, 9:30am in the Bowman building Tween Room. Exploring how and why we worship, learners will engage Scripture, investigate the bulletin, and learn the essential prayers and creeds we use in worship. This class culminates with our children helping lead March 30 worship as we recognize their commitment to deepen their understanding of faith.
- •Chapel Time during a portion of the worship hour every Sunday. Four years 2nd graders can leave the sanctuary with adult leaders, after the Children's message, to explore the day's scriptures. They return to the sanctuary during the offertory.
