

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND FORMATION

SUNDAY SCHOOL FROM 9:30AM-10:20AM

Sunday mornings at 9:30am are a primary time of formation for SAPC children and their families! During this time, children engage in faith teaching by vetted and trusted adults through play, Bible instruction, song, prayer, art, science and more! It is a time where children are invited into community with their peers and safe adults to belong and ask questions and explore what it means to be a follower of Jesus! Sunday School is offered for ages 5-5th grade upstairs in the Bowman building.

CHILDREN'S WORSHIP DURING 10:30 AM WORSHIP

This is a short and sweet time for children ages 5-2nd grade to learn what it means to worship God through the many facets of worship. Often, this brief time (from after the Children's Sermon to after the adult sermonapproximately 20-25 minutes) includes singing, storytelling, dancing, playing instruments, engaging in games, and a brief activity. Children are invited to join for the beginning part of worship in the sanctuary, follow their teachers out following the Children's Message to head to the chapel, and rejoin their parents/guardians in the sanctuary following Children's Worship.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR for ages 4 through 5th grade, will be on Wednesdays, October 8 – 29 starting at 5:15pm.



CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL

Children, ages five – 5th grade, meet in the Bowman building. The Biggest Story leads learners through the Bible, teaching 104 Bible stories. On October 26 and November 2, the 3rd - 5th graders will engage in *Reading Your Bible* as their parents focus on the same subject in the Adult Milestone Class in the Library.


FALL PROGRAMING: ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL



This intergenerational class welcomes everyone from 6th graders to adults.

Guided by a teaching team committed to deep Bible study, we will explore God's Word, ask questions, share insights across generations, and prepare our hearts and minds for worship as one community of faith.

We are walking through the Gospel of Luke by "Living the Story Together," studying the same scriptures and themes in our weekly worship and sermons. This curriculum is also offered at 9:50am on the Quail Campus (Quail Lambeth Parlor).



On October 5 and 12, this class will wrap up their study of *The Big Relief* by David Zahl.

October 19 - November 23 The Bible Tells Me So by Peter Enns:

Join us for a new six-week study based on the spiritual odyssey of evangelical scholar Peter Enns. The more he studied the Bible, the more he wrestled with questions like "Is this what God really requires?" and "Does divine inspiration mean ignoring the Bible?" Discover how he came to see beyond restrictive doctrine and learned to embrace



This new adult milestone class is for parents of all ages and stages.


