

#### **Congregational Discernment and Called Congregational Meeting**

After several months of discernment and research, the Sessions of SAPC and QHPC voted unanimously to merge into one church with two campuses. Now, you are invited into a season of discernment as the congregation will vote on the recommendation Sunday, November 24. Over the next several weeks, the Planning team will address the biggest question, "Why Merge?". Supporting details faithfully uncovered during the discernment process are available, <u>here</u>. The documentation includes the reasons for the merger,

FAQs, administrative details (such as staffing and financial plans) and Risks/Mitigation strategies. Please contact a member of the Planning committee or Rev. Raible if you have any questions or would like to speak directly with someone on the Planning committee. Co-Chairs for Planning are Ed Thomas and Hannah King.

**Why merge?** As a result of three years of discernment and strategic planning, Selwyn's identity was reaffirmed and its 'North Star Vision' vision was cast and adopted by the Session in 2023. This vision, in part, states, "... we seek to impact the lives of children, youth and their families through community building, worship, early childhood development, and the deep care of those suffering from despair (mental, spiritual and emotional wellness)." A merger allows Selwyn the potential to realize its vision by expanding engaging partnerships and leadership beyond the SAPC community to include those on the QHPC campus and other organizations within the city.
