CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND FORMATION

NURSERY 9:30AM AND 10:30AM Children (age 6 weeks—age 4) are invited to a safe space in the lower level Child Development Center to play and be cared for by trusted and vetted adults. They will be provided age-appropriate activities and activities about following God.

CHILDREN 'S SUNDAY SCHOOL AND MILESTONE CLASSES 9:30AM-10:20AM A primary time of formation for children and their families. Children engage in faith teaching by trusted adults through play, Bible instruction, song, prayer, art, science and more. Children are invited into community with their peers and safe adults to belong, ask questions, and explore what it means to be a follower of Jesus. Sunday School is offered for ages 5-5th grade upstairs in the Bowman building.

CHILDREN'S WORSHIP DURING 10:30AM SERVICE A short and sweet time for children ages 5 - 2nd grade to learn what it means to worship God through the many facets of worship. This brief time (after the Children's Sermon to after the adult sermon- approximately 20-25 minutes) can include singing, storytelling, dancing, music, games, and an activity. Children join the beginning part of worship in the sanctuary, follow their teachers out after the Children's Message to head to the chapel, then rejoin their parents/guardians in the sanctuary.

WEDNESDAY EVENINGS, **5:30 - 7PM**, **CHILDREN'S CHOIR AND COMMUNITY MEAL FOR ALL AGES** Children aged 4 - 5th grade are invited to join the choir. Rehearsals will be on October 8, 15, 22, and 29, 5:30 – 6pm in the Chapel. Children will engage in worshipful activities on November 5, 12, and 19. 
FALL PROGRAMING: ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL



Beginning September 7, this intergenerational class welcomes everyone from 6th graders to adults.


