




THE LORD'S PRAYER

(All are welcome and all bread is gluten-free.)


Please come forward by the center aisle and return to your seats using the side aisles. You may receive communion, anointing with oil, or both.

What Wondrous Love Is This 215



With its ballad-like repetitions before and after each stanza's central narrative lines, this meditative text needs performance in order to be effective. Its haunting melody proves the means of convincing us that the only adequate response to "wondrous love" is to "sing on."

IN WORSHIP

Our hymn after the sermon, "This Is a Day of New Beginnings," reminds us we are new people in Christ and receivers of God's grace. We can start afresh today. But moving on has a catch – there is need to put to "rest the pain that's gone." There is the need to leave behind "disappointment, guilt and grieving." As we embrace "a day of new beginnings," may we open ourselves to the Spirit's leading and consider what opportunities and blessings God might have in store for us. Internationally published hymn writer – poet Brian Wren (b. 1936) wrote this text for a 1978 New Year's Day service at Holy Family Church, Blackbird Leys, Oxford, England.

The Chancel Choir sings the anthem "Lord, For Thy Tender Mercy's Sake," as part of the invitation to Communion. The origin of the piece is uncertain. Although commonly ascribed to the English composer Richard Farrant (c. 1525-1580), it has also been attributed to John Hilton (1599 – 1657). The text is taken from *Christian Prayers and Holy Meditations* (1566) by Henry Bull. This choral prayer suggests a humble sense of repentance, and a calm, confident trust in grace. The first 12 measures are sung homophonically, then slight imitation begins at "that we may walk in a perfect heart." The closing imitative "Amen" is found in only a few sources and could be considered optional.


Writing Our Faith Legacy Stories | Apr. 9th | 6:00 -7:00 pm


