# GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE

April 18, 2025, 7:00 pm

Tenebrae is the Latin word for "darkness." The service of Tenebrae, sometimes referred to as a Service of Shadows, has been observed since the ninth century. A meditation on Christ's suffering, readings trace the story of his passion, music portrays his pathos, and silence and darkness symbolize the approaching of his death and hopelessness in the world without God.

The bell toll near the end of the service represents Jesus' 33 years on earth.






## THE SHADOW OF THE GARDEN

## THE SHADOW OF ARREST

Mark 14: 43-50

"Shadows Lengthen Into Night" | SHADOWS

Sharing Paschal bread and wine as the daylight ebbs away,

Friends at table join to dine. One of them will soon betray. Shadows lengthen into night. In a grove of olive trees underneath a dark'ning sky,

Jesus warns what he foresees: Peter also will deny. Shadows lengthen into night.

In the garden, still and deep, those he asked to watch and pray,
