Jesus loves us, forgives us, and sets us free.



This setting expands and enhances the thematic inclusiveness of an early 20th-century text by adapting the melody of a traditional spiritual to carry these words. This 1940 pairing marked the first use of African American musical material in a mainline North American hymnal.

IN WORSHIP

American composer and arranger Marty Haugen (born 1950) wrote our opening hymn, No. 301, "Let us Build a House," for a church dedication in Minnesota. The five stanzas use the imagery of construction, but the real emphasis is not on a physical structure but a spiritual one. The essential frame of reference is those who inhabit this place, affirming the vital distinction that the church is not the building but the people. Of the hymn, Haugen has stated he wanted to write a text, "that reflects the welcome to table fellowship that Jesus offered unconditionally to everyone." The tune name, TWIN OAKS, refers to two large oaks that frame Haugen's uncle and aunt's house in Michigan, where he wrote the hymn. Marty Haugen was raised in the American Lutheran Church, received a BA in psychology from Luther College, yet has worked for the Roman Catholic Church for most of his life. He is currently composer in residence at Mayflower Community Congregational Church, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Over 400 of Haugen's compositions are published, including 13 hymns in *Glory to God*.

The song following the sermon, "Draw the Circle Wider," was composed by Matthew Black specifically for today's service for the Lord's Day. Matthew is a singer-songwriter and worship leader with deep roots in the Presbyterian Church (USA). The literal son of a preacher man, he left his job as a mild-mannered IT manager in 2022 to make music fulltime. His sophomore album was released in May 2024 and is available wherever you listen to music and at matthewblackmusic.com. Matthew is giving a free concert here at Northminster today at 5:00 p.m.

The anthem, "Verleih uns Frieden," composed by Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1847), calls us into a time of prayer this morning. Mendelssohn, a German Romantic composer, may be primarily known as a composer of organ works, symphonies and the oratorios *Elijah* and *St. Paul*, but he wrote a number of smaller sacred choral works as well. Set to a text by Martin Luther, the text and melody are presented three times: first sung by basses and tenors, then by altos and sopranos as basses and tenors sing counterpoint, and finally with four-part chorus. Composed in 1831 after a visit to the Vatican, the piece is a calm and confident plea for peace.
