Each community of local church believers shares the same vision and values. Together, we build the kingdom of God by aiming at the same goals and equipping every member to play their part. *Everyone* is needed. We all have spiritual gifts God wants to use to build his kingdom.

PETRA’S HISTORY

Petra began as a church plant in 1983. Petra is part of the *Hopewell Network of Churches*, a nondenominational fellowship of churches with Anabaptist roots. The network consists of about 17 churches stateside and 9 international networks worldwide! Petra also values collaborating with other like-minded ministries both locally and globally.

OUR CORE VALUES

These are the non-negotiable priorities that drive everything we do here at Petra Church. We are passionate about these 7 Values!

1. The Father Heart of God

We love seeing people awoken to the fatherly love of God. God, the infinite creator, and perfect judge, loves each one of his children uniquely. This revelation of his goodness helps us relate to his healing, affection, and friendship as well as his instruction, protection, and government.

2. Devotion to Jesus

We are passionate about every person encountering Jesus and experiencing personal salvation and relationship in him. Our goal is for everyone to follow him, grow in him, love like him, serve like him, and lead like him.

3. Empowerment of the Holy Spirit

We want to abide in the Holy Spirit and participate in his ongoing ministry, gifts, and power to grow as Jesus' disciples and complete the mission he entrusted to us.

4. Commitment to Scripture, Worship, and Prayer

We prioritize the authority of God's Word in our lives and cultivating habits of worship and prayer, both personally and in communal gatherings. These are essential to our connecting to God's presence and Lordship.

5. Living in Community

We express loving relationships as a church family by connecting, caring, serving, growing, and leading in healthy groups and teams.

6. Healing and Freedom

We are devoted to developing a culture of compassion and healing. Freedom comes through God's gracious love and redemptive truths, and through loving and committed relationships. These are essential ingredients to the restoration of our lives, families, and communities.

7. Sharing Jesus and Serving Others

We are committed to sharing Jesus' love, healing, and hope through personal relationships and intentional outreach locally and globally. We build God's kingdom through practical and spiritual gifts to meet needs and serve others.

PETRA PRACTICES

Here are some ways we may do things differently than other churches.

1. PERSONAL SALVATION

Here at Petra, we believe everyone needs to experience their own personal salvation and relationship with Jesus Christ. *1 Corinthians 3:11, Matthew 16:16-18*

— Other churches may believe that being born a Christian, being born into a Christian family, or “going to church” is what makes us Christian.

2. BELIEVER’S BAPTISM

Here at Petra, we believe every believer is baptized into God’s global family based on their own confession of relationship with Jesus Christ. *Mark 16:16, Matthew 28:19*

— Other churches may believe in being baptized as a child or equating baptism into God’s global family with a commitment to their church through membership.

3. EVERYONE IS A MINISTER

Here at Petra, we believe that God equips every believer in the community to be a minister of his love, grace, and truth. *1 Peter 2:5-9, 2 Corinthians 3:6*

— Other churches may believe that only a clergy can do ministry work.

4. A TRANSFORMED LIFESTYLE

Here at Petra, we believe every believer is trusting in God’s grace while daily being conformed to Jesus’ perfect love and truth. *Acts 2:42-47, Matt. 16:24-25*

— Other churches may believe in relying on creeds, communion, or ideology to affirm “right standing” with God.

5. BIBLICAL CHURCH LEADERSHIP

Here at Petra, we believe New Testament leaders operated within a team of elders who discerned God’s vision, strategy, and wisdom for the community. *Acts 15, 14:23, 16:4*

— Other churches may believe in voting on church decisions or imparting authority with no accountability.

BECOMING A MEMBER

If you believe God is calling you to make Petra your “home church,” we encourage you to consider taking the next step of commitment to our church community by becoming a member.

COMMITMENTS:

1. GROWING SPIRITUALLY: I commit to...

- Growing my personal relationship with Jesus through regular habits of worship, prayer, and reading his Word.

2. GROWING IN COMMUNITY: I commit to...

- regularly attending Sunday services
- cultivating honest relationships in teams and groups
- striving towards love and forgiveness for one another
- striving towards truth and accountability with a heart of compassion
- speaking in ways that builds others up

3. CONTRIBUTING TO PETRA’S MISSION: I commit to...

- praying for Petra’s growth and health
- sharing the gospel with those God has placed in my life
- welcoming and caring for those in our Petra community
- discovering and using my gifts and talents
- regularly tithing 10% of my income to God’s kingdom in and through this church

4. SUPPORTING CHURCH LEADERSHIP AND AUTHORITY: I commit to...

- supporting the vision, values, and purpose of my church and its leadership
- following the Biblically-based direction and counsel of the leaders
- coming under the spiritual authority and accountability of this community
- making every effort to protect the unity of the church

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. SALVATION IN JESUS.** I have personally received Jesus Christ as my Savior.
- 2. WATER BAPTISM.** I am 10 years old or older and have been publicly baptized as a believer.
- 3. BELONG.** I have completed all 5 BELONG topics.
- 4. AFFIRMING PETRA'S VALUES.** I affirm all of Petra's core values, especially the *full authority, inspiration, and practice of the scriptures*, as the source of ultimate truth and accountability for both my life and church life. I also agree with the *affirmation of the Holy Spirit's ministry and authority* in the believer's life today: his holiness, his fellowship, his gifts, and his unique baptism of power.
- 5. NEXT STEP CONVERSATION.** I have scheduled or have already had this one-on-one conversation with one of our pastors/leaders. *Once you have completed all 5 BELONG topics, you will receive an email with a link to schedule this conversation.*
- 6. MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION.** I have filled out the membership application (*found at the end of this packet*) and have turned it in at BELONG or at one of the Hubs.

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION:

If you agree to these commitments and have completed all 5 BELONG topics, then you may fill out a *Membership Application*—provided at the end of this packet. Your signature on the application is your way of committing yourself to Petra's church community.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

- We believe in one God, eternally existing as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
Deut. 6:4, Heb. 11:6, Matt. 28:19
- We believe in Jesus Christ as God who became flesh, born of a virgin. He lived a sinless life, was crucified for our sins, was resurrected from the dead, and ascended, sitting at the right hand of the Father as the exalted Lord and head of the church.
Jn. 1:14, Heb. 1:1-6, Phil. 2:5-8, Rom. 1:4, Col. 1:15-19, Eph. 1:22-23
- We believe in the deity and person of the Holy Spirit, his indwelling presence, regenerating work, empowering baptism, spiritual gifts, and equipping ministry in the church today.
Ezk. 36:26, Joel 2:28-29, Acts 1:4-5, 2:1-18, Jn. 14:26, 16:7-10, 13
- We believe that all Scripture is the inspired, infallible, authoritative Word of God and is fully reliable and trustworthy.
2 Tim. 3:16, 2 Peter 1:20-21, Gal. 1:11-12, Prov. 30:5, Jn. 10:35, Heb. 4:12
- We believe God created the heavens and earth and all that is in them in six days. We believe God has created human beings in his divine image with a special dignity accorded to them out of all the works of creation. They were made for relationship with God.

- We believe, beginning with Adam and Eve's sinful rebellion, we have all received a sinful nature and have been given over to the enslaving powers of evil and eternal death and separation from God.

- We believe that only through Jesus Christ, God offers salvation from sin and a new way of life. We receive God's salvation and are born again by the Spirit of God when we repent and accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. It is by faith, through God's grace, that we are saved.

- We believe that the church is the assembly of those who have accepted God's offer of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. It is the new community of disciples sent into the world to proclaim the reign of God.

- We believe that the mission of the church is to take the Gospel of the Kingdom to all the nations, making disciples of them, baptizing them, and teaching them to observe all things as commanded by Jesus Christ. The mission of the church includes ministry to the poor and helpless.

- We believe that the baptism of believers with water is a pledge of their covenant with God. It identifies them with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. It is a sign of their cleansing and freedom from sin and their commitment to walk in the way of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. Immersion is the primary mode of baptism.

- We believe that through the Lord's Supper, the church renews its covenant with God and with each other and participates in the life and death of Jesus Christ until he comes.

- We believe in practicing discipline in the church to liberate erring brothers and sisters from sin and to restore them to a right relationship with God and to fellowship in the church.

- We believe marriage is between one man and one woman. All sexual activity outside of marriage, including fornication, adultery, and homosexuality, is sin.

- We believe that Jesus Christ calls us to discipleship, to take up our cross and follow him.

- We believe it is God's will for Christians to refrain from violence in human relationships. Led by the Holy Spirit, we will follow Christ in the way of peace.

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APPENDIX: TITHE

Financial giving is a Biblical principle taught in both the Old and New Testament. God directed his people to give the first fruit of their crops and herds, 10% of their income, and special offerings throughout the year.

The practice of giving one-tenth of our income, “tithe,” to God is found in the first book of the Bible. Abraham tithed through the priest Melchizedek 430 years before the Law of Moses required it (Genesis 14:20, Hebrews 7:1-10). Jacob is later seen practicing the tithe in Genesis 28:20-22. Later, the Mosaic law gave clear instruction to tithe on all their cash, crops, and animals (Leviticus 27:30-32, Deuteronomy 14:24-25, 26:1-15, 2 Chronicles 31:4-14).

Tithe was Considered 10% of a Person’s Income

Whatever income is to us—whether it be our salary, business, gifts, or inheritance—is considered money that flows through our hands. In the New Testament, we continue to see the spiritual community practice giving a tithe of all they possessed (Matthew 23:23). Instead of declaring that tithing is no longer part of the New Covenant, Jesus instructed that it was proper and right to give their tenth. Nowhere does Jesus say the tithe is discontinued.

Your Money Shows Where your Heart is

The Bible says, “where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” (Matthew 6:21). If you invest your money in God’s kingdom, your heart will be free from the need or greed of money and will be freer to love God’s kingdom. If you prioritize your own needs, wants, and concerns, your heart will continue to be weighed down by worry, anxiety, and greed and will be reluctant to give towards God’s purposes.

Prioritizing God First

All worthy organizations and visions require money and physical commodities to achieve their goals—for example, the advancement of science, endowment for the arts, fighting poverty, etc. By investing the first 10% of your income, you are prioritizing God’s mission and purposes before your own purposes.

Where to Give the Tithe

God instructed that their tithe and first-fruits offerings were to be brought into the storehouse and not given elsewhere (Nehemiah 10:37, 13:12, Malachi 3:10). The storehouse was part of the temple or the equivalent of the church system of today. The Levites were the ones who staffed the temple. It was out of the collected tithes that the ministries of the temple and employment in the temple were funded. Poor persons were also cared for out of the storehouse provision (Nehemiah 10:35-39, 12:44). The local church is roughly the equivalent of the storehouse today. As a rule of thumb, tithe is given to the local church for the advancement of God’s purposes through that church family. God has continued the system of the tithe to fund the ministry and purpose of the local church.

When we hold back the tithe, the work of the local church suffers, God takes it personally. The tithe is a debt we owe to God. The prophet Malachi says we are robbing God if we don't bring our full tithe into the storehouse (Malachi 3:7-12).

When they brought their tithe into the storehouse, they put it into the priest's hands as an undesignated gift for them to use as they discerned best. The same is true today. The tithe is given as an undesignated gift to be used in the way the local church leadership discerns the Holy Spirit is leading them. Primarily for supporting staff, facilities, and ministries by caring for people and reaching the lost.

Offerings

In addition to the tithe, there were other types of offerings and collections people were encouraged to participate in. These additional offerings were called "freewill offerings" or "thank offerings." This was not considered a debt to God (like the tithe) but was a love gift to God to show one's gratitude and love for God (Exodus 36:3-7, Deuteronomy 12:6, Ezra 2:68). This was given either to the local storehouse or to other projects such as the building of the tabernacle and temple. In the New Testament, it was used as a special mission offering to help the poor beyond their local church; it was considered a freewill offering (2 Corinthians 8-9). Offerings beyond the tithe can be designated for purposes such as alms to the poor, supporting a missionary, giving to non-profit organizations, building pledges, etc.

Mutual Honor

If we honor God in our giving, he will honor us for our faith and obedience. We teach the importance of tithes and offerings, not just because the church has needs but because it's God's way to free us from greed and enter his financial blessings for our lives. When we honor God with our giving, he promises to watch over us and provide for us.

Malachi 3:10-12

Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. "Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it. I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not cast their fruit," says the LORD Almighty.

When we follow God's principles with the right motives, he, in return, pours out his blessing on our lives. Some say they can't afford to give. But the truth is, we can't afford **not** to give. For when we give, God blesses and multiplies the seed that we sow (Proverbs 3:9-10, 2 Corinthians 9:6-11, Luke 6:38).

Tithing usually begins with a choice to trust God. It may feel unwise or emotionally difficult at first. But we must trust that God will take care of us if we prioritize his kingdom first. God desires us to give with a joyful heart because we love him and want to honor him. Perfect love is always joyful, generous, and sacrificial, and that includes the use of our finances.
