# **OPENING PRAYER**

Begin your session with a prayer, asking God to guide your discussion and help you apply the teachings to your lives.

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- We will all give an account for how we've used the resources God has entrusted to us.
- 2. Integrity is more valuable than any financial gain we might seek.
- 3. God values relationships and people over material wealth.
- 4. We should use our money and resources to invest in people, as they are the true, lasting treasure.
- 5. God's grace and generosity often surprise us, prioritizing restoration of relationships over strict justice.

# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. What was your initial reaction to Jesus' parable of the dishonest manager? How did it challenge your expectations?
- 2. Pastor Brian mentioned that "money exposes the insecurities and appetites of our hearts." How have you seen this play out in your own life or in society?
- 3. Discuss the statement: "My checkbook is a scorecard to indicate what I find most valuable in life." What does your spending reveal about your priorities?
- 4. How does the idea of using "worldly wealth to gain friends" challenge our typical view of money and relationships?
- 5. The sermon emphasizes that people are the true treasure, not money. How might this perspective change the way we approach our finances and relationships?
- 6. Share a time when you've seen someone use their resources to invest in people in a meaningful way. What was the impact?

# PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

- 1. Conduct a "priority audit" of your spending habits. Does it align with your values and what you believe God prioritizes?
- 2. Identify one way you can use your resources (time, money, skills) this week to invest in a relationship or help someone in need.
- 3. Reflect on areas where you might be tempted to compromise integrity for financial gain. Commit to addressing these areas.
- 4. Create a "generosity budget" set aside a portion of your income specifically for blessing others and building relationships.
- 5. Practice viewing people as God's treasures this week. How might this change your interactions and decisions?

# **CLOSING PRAYER**

Thank God for His generous heart and ask for wisdom in using resources to invest in eternal things – particularly people and relationships.
