#### **WORSHIP**

#### **OPENING PRAYER**

Begin your session with a prayer, asking God for protection, wisdom, and guidance as you discuss the questions.

## **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- 1. Believers in Christ are sanctified set apart for God's purpose and made holy.
- 2. Sanctification is both immediate (positional) and ongoing (progressive).
- 3. As Christians, we are sent by God, just as Jesus was sent by the Father.
- 4. Our calling and commitments are meant to be lived out in community, not in isolation.

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. What does it mean to be "sanctified" as believers? How does this concept challenge or encourage you in your faith journey?
- 2. The sermon mentions three aspects of sanctification. Which of these do you find most relevant to your current spiritual state, and why?
  - Positional: When a person is saved through faith in Jesus Christ, they are immediately and irrevocably set apart for God, made holy in their standing before Him.
  - **Progressive**: This is the ongoing process of a believer's spiritual growth and conformity to the image of Christ. It is a cooperative work with the Holy Spirit.
  - **Ultimate**: This the final, future aspect where believers are permanently set apart from the presence of sin when they receive their eternal bodies in heaven.
- 3. Pastor Brian shared examples of Moses, Jonah, and Gideon pushing back against God's calling. Have you ever felt resistant to God's calling in your life? Share your experience.
- 4. How does understanding that we are "sent" by God impact your view of your daily life and interactions?
- 5. The sermon emphasizes that believers are both sanctified and sent together. How does this collective aspect of faith challenge our individualistic tendencies?
- 6. Reflect on the Petra Core Value: "Sharing Jesus and Serving Others." How have you seen this value lived out in our church community?

## PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

- 1. Identify one area in your life where you need to embrace your "sanctified" status. How can you live this out practically this week?
- 2. Reflect on how God might be "sending" you in your current life circumstances. What small step can you take to respond to this calling?
- 3. Choose one way to intentionally engage in community this week, whether through serving, encouragement, or spiritual conversation.

#### **CLOSING PRAYER**

Thank God for sanctifying us and sending us together as a community. Ask for His guidance in living out our calling and commitments in unity with fellow believers.
