We boarded planes from different states to embark on a once in lifetime adventure. Ten of my family members saved and traveled to Alaska for an elevenday fishing trip. We made many preparations before the trip, from buying Alaskan fishing and hunting licenses, renting an Airbnb home, getting transportation, the right equipment for the freezing water, learning fishing sites and securing space on a chartered boat to catch large halibut fish in the Alaskan freezing waters. The trip was amazing!

We started our adventure, leaving port and traveling 38 miles out into the ocean, seeing seals and catching big halibut. The weather was cold, but we were prepared. The Alaskan government has laws in place to catch large fish, and you must be on a chartered boat. Only 2 fish per person are allowed and once caught, they are measured for the minimum length and if they are below, must be released. The day we were out on the ocean, it was reported that 2,000 halibut were caught. For the remainder of the trip, we fished in two different rivers, Swift River Creek and Alaskan Creek, catching large salmon. On the first day of salmon fishing, we saw a large black bear on the other side of the river, looking for what we were trying to catch...salmon! The water is crystal blue and pack a swift current. We saw many "creatures" also looking for large salmon. The next day a small black bear came into proximity of my brother. To get the bear away, he started to beat on the rocks. We knew the mother bear was nearby, but we were prepared with bear spray and other types of protection. Bears are peculiar, they will not attack unless provoked. We were not there to provoke the bears but to enjoy one of the many fascinating trips available to us.

The members of our first fishing expedition were, Gail McGraw, retired US Army, 33 years, Jennifer; sibling, her spouse Lloyd Byrdie, 21 years, retired Army, Calvin Newton, 21 years retired Marine, Marilyn Newton; sibling, Wyoma Moses, retired Army 25 years (holding the large fish on the chartered boat) Johnnie Jacobs; sibling, retired Air Force, 21 years, Josh Jacobs, US Army combat soldier, Johnie Jacobs Jr, Medic Coast Guard, Sarah Jacobs GS13, US government, Dottie Jacobs, retired teacher, Marilyn, 30 yrs Dept of Social Service in Florida, and Jennifer, Retired Army Spouse. We do plan to have more adventurous trips as a family, extending our legacy through all generations of Johnnie and Emma Jacobs.

Many watched as we rushed to our charter boat, with one person saying, "you must be important," I ask why and my reply was, "we are important, we belong to Jesus!" We all made it to Alaska, traveled many miles on the ocean and made it back home, safely. The captain said we were the first African Americans to charter a boat to fish.



Knowledge is POWER

Lack of knowledge is the state or fact of not having enough information, education, or awareness about something. Hosea 4:6 states "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children."

When we have knowledge, we are no longer subject to selfish agendas and can make well informed decisions that are not controlled by emotions.

In an effort to inform parents about school choice options, members of the Economic Empowerment, and Political Action ministries are collaborating to provide information that will empower them with the knowledge, tools and support needed to make well informed decisions for their children.

The North Carolina Opportunity **Scholarship** aims to empower the upcoming generations of North Carolina through access to options that previously may not have been available. Since 2014 the program has been providing private school vouchers to K-12 students. Families can use these school vouchers to pay for tuition, transportation, equipment, and other necessary private school expenses. The funds that will be available in the next two fiscal years are:

2024-2025 \$191,540,000 2025-2026 \$415,540,000 after that the amount will be increased by \$15,000,000 up until 2031.

Springfield supports education as a whole and our actions for public schools are shown in support of East Garner Middle School as our adopted school. However, there is not one size that fits all for K-12 students and parents, just like it's not for college.

For those who want to address the financial impact of our public schools please familiarize yourselves with North Carolina's Leandro case. It is a decades-old education case alleging that children were not receiving an adequate publicschool education, as required by the state constitution.

After multiple judges, several trips to the state supreme court, a 300-page report on how to improve school conditions, later Republican and controlled legislatures that failed to act, not to mention an untold number of court filings — the case remains open and unfinished. As a result, \$1.7 billion that was ordered to be disbursed for the first two years of the plan has not been released.

The total amount at stake is \$5.6 billion and the State of North Carolina has a state surplus of \$6 billion.

What can we do? Pray and get to know the elected officials who are blocking the flow of these funds. They are likely the same ones who approved the funding for the Opportunity Scholarships.


After getting to know the officials, if you don't like what they stand for, work on a strategy to replace them.

New Orleans Seafood & Chicken Gumbo!

Here's what you will need:

1 large soup pot

Ingredients:

1 large pack of smoke or spicy sausage (sliced)

10 to 15 drummettes

4 smoke turkey necks

6 cleaned (boiled) crabs broken in two (I get the blue crabs from Earps) (optional)

40 to 50 pack raw, peeled and tail off shrimp (optional)

1 large onion (finely chopped)

1 celery stalk (finely chopped)

1 pk of green onion (finely chopped)

6 dried bay leaves

1 large green bell pepper (finely chopped)

1 large red bell pepper (finely chopped)

Salt or Tony's seasoning or your favorite creole seasoning (use as desired)

Pepper (use as desired)

Thyme (use as desired)

Gumbo File'

Roux or 6 pks of Brown gravy (prepare according to the package)

Roux or 6 pks of Brown gravy (prepare according to the package)

- 1. Saute sausage, chicken, turkey necks, onion, green onion, bell peppers and bay leaves in a large pot; stirring all ingredients until the meat begins to brown, roughly 30 minutes.
- 2. Add the roux or 6 pk gravy mixture (mix as stated on the pack) into the pot. Fill the pot with water, about a quarter or 4th of an inch from the top. Add desired amount of Tony's seasoning and boil for another 30 minutes.
- 3.Add shrimp, crab and Thyme (desired amount) and continue to boil. Lightly sprinkle the File' over the top (sprinkle, sprinkle, sprinkle, because File' is what makes the GUMBO taste like Gumbo but it can become very thick and mushy if you put too much in the pot.
- 4.Cook/Boil for about 30 minutes to an hour. Remove from the stove and let sit for 15 to 20 minutes and immediately place in the refrigerator IF you use SHRIMP and Crab. If you exclude the seafood, you can leave the pot on the stove until it cools off and then place in the refrigerator.

Let sit overnight and the next day, cook a pot of jasmine or long grain rice. Do not heat up the entire pot unless you plan to eat it. I suggest only heating up what you plan to eat, and enjoy! Don't forget the Potato Salad. Yes, we eat a spoon of potato salad, along with the gumbo and rice in a bowl.

Tydy

This gumbo recipe has been in our family for years.

This is not "soup" as my husband called it when I first introduced him to this famous well known family cuisine. Gumbo is a bowl of creole love and is typically paired with homemade potato salad. Barely Escaping the Flames A Spoken Word By Lorraine (LW) Smith



Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. Store your treasures in Heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal. Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be. Matthew 6:19-21.

For no one can lay any Foundation other than one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay or straw, their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. If what has been built survives, the builder will receive a reward. If it is burned up, the builder will suffer loss, but, yet will be saved—even though only as one escaping through the flames. 1 Corinthians 3:11-15.

Barely Escaping the Flames

Long ago when I was a Jr. Missionary, once a month, the church Mission group would visit the Sick and Shut-In at a local nursing home. On my first visit, I entered one of the residents' rooms, whose name was Agnes, to give her a Care Package. Miss Agnes held onto my hand tightly as she thanked me for coming and asked me to sit with her.

"For just a little while," she pleaded, "and if it is ok with you, I would like to tell you a story about something that happened to me recently." I love a good story and this woman had a way about her—I could see God's favor upon her face. I pulled up a chair to listen.

"One night I fell off into a deep sleep," the old lady began. In a dream, I found myself standing in a long line of people and we all were dressed in beautiful white clothes. There were words written on the front of the podium in gold letters that said, "THE BOOK OF LIFE." When I stepped up to the podium, the Angel flipped the pages back and forward.

Worried, I gave the Angel my name. "Aah Agnes," he replied and started turning to the back of the big book.

I wondered why my name was in the back section of the Book of Life because it starts with the letter "A."

"Please step forward and receive Your Works," the Angel said.

I guess I didn't get to bring any of those nice things with me. I remembered another missionary outing I did with the Prison Ministry-surely that must count for something. But a memory rushed into my thoughts of me standing in a corner because I was afraid to be touched by the prisoners, who the other Missionaries openly embraced. I realized that I might not have anything in my Box of Works. Even when the Mission went out in the

community to feed the Homeless, I waited in the Church van and looked through fashion magazines I had brought along with me.

As the line of Believers moved forward, I saw a man place his beautiful gold box on the altar and it was immediately engulfed in magnificent flames of many colors. When the flames died down his works had turned into shiny gold refined by the fire. That man stepped forward to receive his reward, and a beautiful gold Crown with jewels was placed on his head. By then I had to know what was inside my box, so I barely opened the lid and saw a lump of wood—I wanted to cry. A voice whispered, "There is no crying in Heaven."

When it was my turn, I stepped up to the altar and held onto my little box. An Angel standing by noticed my hesitation, took my box, and placed it on the altar. It was overtaken by flames that quickly died down to a gray-like smoke and when the smoke cleared only ashes remain on the altar-no reward was given to me. The following month when the Mission went back to that nursing home, I immediately went to Miss Agnes' room. Her bed was empty and made up. I asked about her at the front desk and I was told she had passed away three days earlier. I realized I had just missed seeing her again—if only I had not waited a whole month to return. The receptionist asked, "Are you the young lady who visited with her when your church was here last month on the second Sunday?"

"Yes, yes I am!" I told her.

"She left something for you," the receptionist said and handed me a big yellow envelope with "To the Young Missionary" on the front of it. I opened the envelope and inside was this white linen white cloth. It looks like the hem of a garment scorched by fire.

A note was enclosed, and it said: Dear Young Missionary, I wanted to show you this during our visit, but we ran out of time. It was lying beside me when I awoke from the dream I told you about, and it read: Storing up Treasures in Heaven, signed by Agnes.

At that very moment I felt in my spirit that her testimony would bear much fruit in my life. SO MUCH, that in Heaven she will have a Crown to cast at Jesus' feet. As I walked back to my car, I heard a voice whispering in the wind, "Only what you do for Christ will last; only what you do for Christ will last."
