

# REVEREND ERIC L. WINBUSH



## Rev. Eric L. Winbush

Reverend Eric L. Winbush, born and raised in Boston, Massachusetts, husband, father and devoted man of God who loves the Lord. He is the second oldest of six children and always referred to as his mother's "right-hand" because he was often relied upon to take charge while his parents went out to work. This led him to become a "take charge" person later on in life - both at home and on the job. He worked several jobs in various fields in Boston and later he felt that Boston did not have enough to offer him and in 1975 decided to move to New York City.

He got a job working in a NYC Police Department Training Program and worked there for several months after deciding that was not the job for him.

He took a job as a Counselor at the Department of the Aging in Harlem, NY where he assisted seniors in program enrollment, health, and recreational activities. He sometimes prayed and counseled with the seniors. They loved his jovial spirit and the time he devoted to them. He remained there for 11 years which allowed him to develop his craft in counseling and an enduring

relationship and rapport with senior citizens. With his love for sports as a young child and extra time on his hands and as a form of keeping in shape, he decided to get involved in sports at the local gym. It was then that he took a liking to the sport of Boxing which led him into becoming a professional boxer (traveling domestically and internationally). He became ranked as the #3 contender in the world in the lightheavy weight division. All of this was done part-time while working various jobs over the years.

Reverend Winbush always loved the Lord and his passion for studying the Word and spreading the Gospel drew him closer to wanting to learn and study more about God's work.

During this time of working, teaching, and training, he attended church at the invitation of a friend and coworker and went on to become a member of the Brotherhood of the Ethiopian Coptic Orthodox Church in Harlem. After a few years, he was ordained in 1982 as an Associate Minister and became known in the boxing world of sports as the "Bible-toting boxer" because he would always have his Bible and would quote a scripture or encouraging word to others. It was then that he felt there was more in life for him to experience and accomplish on a spiritual level and a career in boxing was never his intention and was never meant to be for him. He still loved the sport but decided to start training others and focusing on the younger generation. He then met his wife Bernice and her daughter Nicole and they were married in

ministry he came away from the part-time professional boxing and devoted more of his time to ministry, drawing closer to God and begin "fighting for the Lord" - reaching souls for Christ. He took a job working as a Court Liaison for the Department of Juvenile Justice in Harlem, NY. He worked there for several years and then landed a job as Warehouse Supervisor at Coca Cola Bottling Company in Queens, NY where he was labeled "preacher-man" and sometimes "coach". He also worked part time as an assistant basketball coach at Queensboro College in Queens, NY and at the Police Athletic League ("PAL") for their youth outreach program of Jamaica, Queens. in 1987 Reverend Winbush along with his wife Bernice and daughter Nicole discontinued their membership at the Ethiopian Coptic Orthodox Church and joined the Baptist House of Prayer under the leadership of Reverend Henry V. Harrison. He was licensed there as an Associate Minister July 28, 1987. With his love and passion for the Lord, preaching, teaching and spreading the gospel, he attended numerous seminary workshops and institutions on Christian ministry and he and his wife participated in prison ministry at the Valhalla

1985. As he grew in the

Correction Facility in Valhalla, NY. He attended the New York School of the Bible and received a certificate of completion in 1991. On June 5, 1994, Reverend Winbush was ordained by a committee of clergy openly professing his love for the Lord and his continued commitment to God to preach, teach and spread the Word of God. During his tenure at the Baptist House of Prayer as Associate Minister, he served in many other capacities and as Catechizer in the ordination service for five newly appointed Deacons.

In January of 2019 Rev. Winbush and his wife relocated to Garner, NC after retiring from

their jobs. After their 32 year membership at the Baptist House of Prayer in New York City, they joined Springfield Baptist Church in November of 2019.



# Black History Among Us





Xenia Weakly I've been a member of the Springfield Baptist church for many years now. The Lord has blessed me in so many ways during my undergraduate career at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. One of which was being able to study abroad in Nagoya, Japan for the fall 2023 semester. I was approached by the Carolina Arts and Sciences Magazine to write an article about my experience and thought I'd share it with my Springfield family as well. You all have always been so supportive of me! I'd also like to give a special shout-out to the scholarship ministry who has blessed me time and time again, with their kindness and generosity. Thank you for your financial assistance and unwavering support which has enabled be to seek out opportunities like this one. Thank you to everyone who sent their love while I was abroad. And thank you to my parents Ian Weakly and Lisa LeVert Weakly who are always there for me. To God be the glory and thank you Springfield!

When I told my friends and family I was studying abroad in Asia, their first response was often "why?" It was so far away and foreign that it seemed strange for me, a Black girl from the tiny town of Clayton, North Carolina, to want to travel there.

I had no personal connection to Asia. I was simply fascinated by the culture and customs of Japan.

I certainly got my fair share of cultural exposure while abroad. The trains were as fast as they were punctual. The food was as delicious as it was inexpensive. Fun was everywhere all the time: Karaoke, arcades, temples, themed cafes, amusement parks. There were some aspects that admittedly took some adjustment. For such a technologically advanced country, Japan sure loves its paperwork. Political talk suddenly became taboo.

Expectations within the classroom were high, and I missed the prioritization of mental health in America.

My biggest help in navigating this unfamiliar territory? The Japanese people themselves.

Although often private, they were extremely thoughtful, considerate and hospitable. While studying at Nanzan University in Nagoya (a modest city close to Kyoto and Osaka), I took a Japanese culture class. My sensei(teacher) shed light on key aspects of the society that I struggled to understand.

During a lecture, she explained that Japan's high population and limited land mass meant that empathy became a cultural practice. From childhood, Japanese citizens are raised to always be considerate - interactions are intended to cause the least amount of inconvenience for both people. This allowed for unspoken understanding, mutual connection and smooth communication. A reflexive sensitivity to others.

I was continually fascinated by interactions with my Japanese peers and how different they were from what I was used to. Before I went abroad, I didn't think of myself as much of an American. Sure, I was a citizen, but I just happened to be born here. However, my national identity became quite clear when put into sharp contrast with others. I was a Black American, descendant of Jamaican ancestors. The way I thought, talked and interacted with the world was far from accidental. Going abroad made it clear to me just how much we are shaped by our national identities. This makes it all the more essential for us to learn about those who are different from ourselves.

This was further reinforced upon my return in speaking with the fellow Phillips Ambassadors in my cohort. Although we went to a variety of countries, something we all returned with was a deeper appreciation of our differences. There is a unique beauty in taking the time and effort to understand something beyond your bubble. Our willingness to engage with people of other cultures resulted in treasured bonds and rich relationships — its own reward.

My time abroad made me realize that I didn't need a special reason to want to go to Japan. Curiosity and a willingness to learn is more than enough. In a rapidly changing world, the only thing that remains constant are people. Reaching out — across seas, across continents, across borders — is as necessary as it is fulfilling. So the next time you find yourself asking why step JAPAN. outside of your comfort zone, instead ask yourself, why not? If your experience is anything like mine, you will have found it well worth the risk.


# Keyes presented to society at the 86th Annual Debutante Ball





# JESUS TAKE THE WHEEL

THE LORD WILL KEEP YOU FROM ALL HARM— HE WILL WATCH OVER YOUR LIFE; THE LORD WILL WATCH OVER YOUR COMING AND GOING BOTH NOW AND FOREVERMORE. PSALMS 121:7-8 (NIV)

How often do we under certain circumstances throw up our hands, roll our eyes, and jokingly or flippantly spew out the words, Jesus Take the Wheel? But on a serious side, how has this phrase served a real purpose? I can attest that this phrase has a genuine meaning. Around 5:30am on the morning of January 17, 2024, this phrase took on a larger than life meaning for me. As my husband, Ben and I were traveling back from West Virginia to move him to Raleigh, an unimaginable incident occurred. While driving in the car, I was about 1 ½ miles ahead of him as he drove the U-Haul truck. We had been chatting on the phone to keep tabs on each other. As I drove south on I-95, just about 25 miles north of Emporia VA, it happened. I drifted from the right lane leftward to the edge of the snow-covered median embankment. I had fallen asleep at the wheel and was awakened just as the car was headed down into the median toward oncoming northbound traffic. As I glared at the headlights of the oncoming cars, I screamed and called on the name of Jesus as I tried frantically to gain control of the car. Praise be to God, I didn't flip or crash; but I was able to maneuver the car and come back up the slippery embankment unto the highway where I then fishtailed for a few seconds and finally came to rest on the right shoulder of the road. Jesus had taken the wheel!!! It all happened so fast. The miraculous thing about the whole incident was that there wasn't a vehicle around me the whole time all of this took place. I could see taillights in the far distance ahead and headlights in the distance through the rearview mirror. Ain't God Good?

THE JOY OF THE LORD IS MY STRENGTH - NEHEMIAH 8:10

This has since caused me to reflect on other times when I have been spared from vehicular danger. I recall the May 5, 1998, accident in which I avoided being hit head-on by a refrigerated truck, as I drove a large delivery truck myself. I eyed the truck as it crossed the center lane headed straight for me as I was able to guide the truck to the right lane and was hit in the driver's side door. Again, I called on the name of lesus. My truck was lifted and rolled on the right-side wheels for a few seconds. As I came down on all sets of wheels, the truck jumped the curb, running over a mailbox while coming to a rest averting going down an embankment on the right-side crashing into a duplex and coming within two feet or so from slamming into a utility pole direct center of the front driver's side. Jesus Took the Wheel! In the Spring of 1987, some five minutes after I had finished planting flowers along the front walkway of my then residence and had moved my supplies to the flower bed on the side of the house, the unexpected occurred. I heard this horrific noise and a person screaming. As I rounded the house, to my surprise, I saw my elderly neighbor frantically sitting in her new car, which was now resting on my front porch with the front bumper tapping the front door after it had traveled directly across the area I had just moved from. I velled, "Oh God, Mrs. Mitchell" and hollered for the other neighbors to come to our aid. We removed her from the car, and I attended to and prayed with her as the neighborhood men guided the car down off the porch and back across the street into her driveway. She wasn't hurt but was badly shaken up. Jesus Took the Wheel. I flashback to my very first brush with a near death experience involving a vehicle. As an eager 4year-old, who loved following her older sister, Chyrle, I begged to go across the street with her as she talked with one of her friends. Getting bored and restless, because she was talking too long, I darted across the street, only to freeze mid-stream as a passing car came to a squealing halt within less than a foot of running over me. My parents came running out of the house as did other neighbors and relatives I remember vividly the frightful look on the driver's face as he exited the car and hearing Momma fussing at Chyrle as she grabbed me. After all the dust had settled, I received the whooping of my life by my earthly father, but nevertheless, my Heavenly Father had spared my life that I might tell the story today. Yes, I can truly say, Jesus Has Taken the Wheel on more than one occasion during the course of my life. I'm so grateful for everyday that I can pick the daisies and not be beneath the ground pushing them up. I realize that God has a purpose for me, and I must continue to walk in it. So, when you see me smile, understand that I know the real meaning behind, lesus Take the Wheel.

# **Celebrating Our History**

On February 17th our children had the opportunity to get a glimpse of our past at the Historic Stagville site in Durham, NC. Historic Stagville is a state historic site that includes the remnants of the largest plantation in North Carolina. The Bennehan-Cameron family owned ~30,000 acres of land, and claimed ownership over 900 people enslaved on the property. The site has buildings constructed from the late 18th century to mid-19th century.







If the front stage delivers the customer experience, the backstage houses the production team that crafts it and, crucially, what goes on behind the scenes is the process of preparing the production team for the task at hand. The attention given the set design makes us more relatable and engaging which connects us to the audience. The set design staff must zoom out and see where and how collaboration can happen behind the scenes to make the whole production process work.

When we all understand our roles and how they play in making the right decisions and how we rely upon each other, it benefits the entire production. At times we wonder if it is true that God works "behind the scenes", unseen by most but there nonetheless, fulfilling His purpose and plan in so many ways. The answer is Yes. 

- 1 box graham crackers crushed
- 16 oz. cream cheese
- 16 oz. powered sugar
- 3 to 4 large bananas peeled and sliced
- 16 oz. fresh or frozen drained if frozen
- 8 oz. crushed pineapple drained
- 16 oz. cool whip
- Chocolate and caramel for drizzling
- Maraschino cherries
- 1 cup of melted butter
- Pineapple chunk to garnish
- 1/2 cup of pecans, caramel sauce and melted chocolate

BANANA SPLIT CAKE

Mix graham cracker crumbs and butter together in a 13 by 9 inch pan bake for 5 minutes until crust has set. Cool crust completely. Blend together cream cheese and powdered sugar until smooth. Spread over crust. Layer strawberries on top of bananas and then follow with a layer of pineapple on top of strawberries. Spread cool whip and cover completely. Garnish with maraschino cherries, and pineapple chunks. Sprinkle with chopped pecans, melted chocolate, and caramel sauce. Return to fridge for 3 to 4 hours to set, then serve. {You can also do this with a yellow cake mix.}
