During this process, I developed a wiper arm and wiper blade for the windshield. What was your motivation behind your idea?

My motivation behind the idea was to improve the operator's experience inside the cabin by increasing the wiper zone on the front glass. A larger wipe zone improves visibility.

WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO A PERSON INTERESTED IN PATENTING AN IDEA?

The advice I would give to a person interested in patenting an idea would be don't worry about how big or how small the idea may be. Trust in yourself and your belief and go ahead and file the patent. Your idea could change the world! Never forget where your talent comes from. I give God all the glory. Through him all things are possible

Greetings triends and tanily.

My name is Ian Weakly. As some of you may know, God has blessed me to have a long and illustrious athletic career. The events that I specialize in are the 400-meters, long hurdles, and mile relays. At 50 years old, I am now competing at the masters level—specifically in the 50-54 age group. I am proud to represent the Atlanta Track Club at the national level as well as internationally I represent USA Track & Field.

I would love to share some of my recent accomplishments with my Springfield family, each of which I am grateful to God for being able to achieve:

- This year, I began my athletic season in April when competing at the N.C. A&T Aggie Classic. I ran the 400m with a time of 52.11. Next, also in April, was the Penn Relays Carnival in Philadelphia. My team and I, representing the Atlanta Track Club, were able to bring home the gold in the 4x400 rels. I am also happy to report that we secured a bronze Medal in 4x100m.
- Moving onto May, I competed in the Aggie Classic last chance with my signature event of the 400m. I want to give all glory to God for being able to run 52.05—the fastest recorded time in the world for this particular competition! Hallelujah for health, strength, and a body that is still capable of setting records!
- In July, I ran at the Pan American Masters Games in Cleveland, Ohio. Again, I competed in the 400m and my time of 51.90 won me the gold as well as set a new record for this competition. My second event was the 400-meter hurdles where I won another Gold Medal and set a World Record of 54.75. I concluded the Pan American Games by competing alongside my team to secure a bronze medal in the 4x100m relay.
- My season concluded with the most important event of the year—the World Masters Athletics Championships, which took
 place in Gothenburg, Sweden. My first event was the 400m hurdles in which I placed first with a time of 56.97. I then
 advanced to the semifinals which I won with a time of 56.58. Last, but certainly not least, I competed in the finals. My time of
 54.91 resulted in a gold medal and another world record. My relay team and I were also proud to be able to take home the
 gold—a great end to a great season.

I am grateful to God for everything that I was able to achieve this year and I give him all the glory for all of these wonderful accomplishments. I take none of it for granted and owe it all to him. Thank you Springfield family and the newsletter ministry for giving me the opportunity to share all the great things the Lord is doing in my life I pray that I might be able to continue inspiring, educating, fellowshipping, competing, and showing my love of the great sport of track-and-field which will always have my heart.

A Different, Different World



Anointed Hands Deaf Ministry



On Saturday, September 21st, the Anointed Hands Deaf Ministry partnered with the North Carolina Division of Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DSDHH) to provide an interactive workshop entitled " A Different, Different World." The event hosted 20 participants and five presenters from the Raleigh and Wilson Regional Centers. Presenters shared their life experiences, educational backgrounds, and struggles with communication access. Other discussion topics included Deaf Culture, hearing loss, and the importance of communication accessibility.

Participants left the event with a wealth of information about the Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard-of-Hearing communities. They also received a new outlook on effective communication. As part of a lip-reading activity, participants watched a presenter mouth ten words and wrote down what they believed the words were. Out of ten words, only one person correctly identified three. This supports the research that says only 30% of what is "read" on the lips is "understood." 30%. Can you imagine catching 30% of what your family is saying? Or, only 30% of a sermon? What about only gathering 30% of what your doctor is telling you? There is still 70% of the message that you aren't privy to. Now transfer that statistic to your life. Can you imagine missing out on 70% of your life?

Communication, not speech, is essential for life, so we are glad to offer workshops like these and plan to offer more educational opportunities.








The Ripple Effect...



Baked Pears with Cinnamon Honey

Ingredients

- 4 medium pears
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 2 tablespoons coconut oil or butter
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

Peel the pears.

Cut the ends off and then cut the pears in half.

Scoop out the core.

Place the pears face down on a baking sheet or in a 9 x 13 glass baking dish.

In a small bowl, combine the honey, cinnamon, coconut oil and vanilla extract and heat in the microwave for 30 seconds. Stir to combine well.

Spoon half of the sauce over the pears.

Bake for 30 minutes until soft and turning brown.

Remove from oven and add additional sauce over each pear.
