This session is designed to study the fundamental principles of biblical interpretation and proper exegesis of Scripture. The historical-grammatical-contextual interpretation is presented as the proper method of interpreting Scripture.

B. Objectives:

- 1. That the student might become aware with the principles of interpretation and the application of those principles to the Scriptures so that the student may come to an understanding of the true meaning of any portion of the Word of God.
- 2. That the student might be able to avoid pitfalls suffered by Christians in the past in regard to the misinterpreting of the Scriptures.
