VIA DE CRISTO RENEWAL AND DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY Oct. 9-12, 2025

What is VIA de CRISTO? — It is a highly structured three-day weekend designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people. There is no cost to participants to attend the weekend.

Dates for 2025 – Thursday Oct 9 – Sunday Oct 12. This weekend is open to married couples and single men and women.

What happens at a VIA de Cristo weekend? — Participants live, study, worship, and commune together daily. Talks are given by lay people as well as clergy, which present the Christian life, based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ. Following each talk the main points of the talk are discussed. There is also music and singing, food and fellowship, a time for laughter and a time for prayer. And the food is really great. It is a powerful and unique weekend where one can truly experience God's love in action.

Who should consider attending? – Those who desire to strengthen their relationship with Christ, attain a new closeness to Christ, attaining a better knowledge of Christ and become better servants of Christ. Attending also provides the opportunity to renew and grow in their faith and learn more about prayer, Bible study, and sharing their faith with others. 

- 1. Where were you born or raised?
 - I was born at Hachita, New Mexico. Then when I was ten years old, we moved to south of McNeal, AZ. It was a ranch and we rode horses after cattle and pitched hay.
- 2. Where did you go to school?
 - I went to a one room schoolhouse. I had to ride a horse to school. When it rained, we couldn't get across the creek to go home. We stayed at an elderly couple's house and when the creek went down, we rode home. Later we rode in an old truck on seats in the truck bed. We rode around the foothills.
 - I went to Douglas High School. During WWII my Dad took me out of school. I worked at an Air Base at Douglas. Eventually, I got a 1946 Chevy green sedan.



- I got married to John Appelin when I was 21 years old. I used to get the mail at the post office in McNeal. He would go there to get his mail and we met. We were married at the Lutheran Church in Douglas. He worked
- in the mines in Bisbee and then he was in the Army. He was stationed in Yuma- a hot place. Then he worked at a bank in Phoenix not long. So, we had moved around. I was cashier on Ft. Huachuca at the Commissary and I also worked at the Food Giant Grocery Store. Altogether, I worked 22 years and raised two children.
- 4. When arrived at SELC / what brought you here?
 We moved to Sierra Vista in 1961. I wanted to join the Lutheran Church.
- 5. What activities have you been involved with here?
 A church friend comes and picks me up for services. I want to go to church. I am now 100 years old. My family had a party for me and so did my church on my birthday in June.
- 6. What are your hobbies or interests?I watch the birds as they come to my feeders. I often go to lunch at Culvers with my friends.My meal is shrimp.
- 7. What is something you'd like to see the church do? I can't see anything wrong with my church.
