Mission Statement

Format

One-week sessions for kids 1st through 6th grade (just completed)

Camp Hours

Monday-Friday, Half Day: 9:00am - 1:00pm

Monday-Friday, Full Day: 9:00am - 4:00pm

Carpool Pick-Up & Drop-Off

Drop-off is 8:50-9:00am and pick-up is 1:-1:15 pm for Half Day Campers and 3:50-4:00pm for Full Day Campers. Enter from Ashford Dunwoody Road and drive to the lower level of the Sports Center. *Look for the Camp Unite Flag and see the map.* Parents, please stay in your vehicle. Staff will meet your camper at drop-off and escort them to their specialty leader daily. Each day, ensure your contact and emergency information are up-to-date on how we can reach you. You will receive a carpool sign on the first day to place in your windshield for pick-up in the afternoon.

- **Drop-off:** Campers will be dropped off in carpool at the lower level Sports Center from 8:50-9:00am.
- **Pick-up:** Carpool pick-up begins at 1:00pm and ends at 1:15pm for Half Day Campers and 3:50-4:00pm for Full Day Campers. Any camper picked up after 1:15pm for Half Day and after 4:15pm for Full Day Campers will be charged \$5 for every 15 minutes that you are late. This fee applies to each child. Payment is due at pick up. Please be on time.

Camp Fees

HALF-DAY FEES:

Before March 1: \$195/week (Week 5: \$157)
March 1 - May 31: \$205/week (Week 5: \$165)
After May 31: \$230/week (Week 5: \$190)

FULL-DAY FEES: (All Sports and Drama only)

Before March 1: \$260/week (Week 5: \$210)
March 1 - May 31: \$270/week (Week 5: \$220)
After May 31: \$295/week (Week 5: \$240)

Registration Fee: A one-time, non-refundable registration fee of \$25 per family. All weekly fees must be paid before your child attends camp. If your balance is not paid, your child will not be allowed to attend camp until it is paid or a payment plan has been established with and approved by the head staff.

Sibling Discount: First child is the regular price for each week registered. Each additional child in the same family on the same order receives a \$10 discount per week registered.

Payment Plan Option: Customers who choose installment billing instead of full payment must pay a deposit of 25% per session to check out. The remaining installments will be paid from the bank account you set up on February 28, March 30, April 30, and May 30. All fees must be paid by May 30. Registrations after May 30 will require full payment.

Cancellation Policy: If you withdraw for any reason for a week that you registered for, you may transfer to another week of camp for no additional charge. However, if you withdraw before April 1, we will refund the fee, less 20%. If you withdraw after April 1, we will refund the fee, less 40%. Refunds will not be given after the Wednesday before the week of camp for which you are registered. All refunds are provided at the discretion of the Camp Director.

Weekly Specialties

Week 1: June 5-8

No Camp Unite this week. Instead, join us for Vacation Bible School—“*Groovin’ to the Beat-itudes*”—at DBC! VBS is for kids ages 4 through 5th Grade (just completed), and it's FREE! Register at dbc.org/vbs.

Week 2: June 12-16

Lacrosse: Campers will learn to develop their lacrosse skills in a fun and competitive way with Certified Coach Julie LaFramboise from Wesleyan High School. They will work on cradling, passing, shooting, stick handling, defense, and basic passing. Equipment will be provided if needed.

Drawing & Watercolor: Improve your drawing skills and learn watercolor while creating various paintings with instructor Victor Kennedy.

Pickleball: Have fun learning this new sport with instructor Sean Bailey and Assistant Faith Giebel. Pickleball is a paddleball sport that combines elements of badminton, ping-pong, and tennis.

Week 3: June 19-23

Art Studio: Work on various fun art projects, including drawing, painting, clay, and sculpture, with instructor Victor Kennedy.

Cooking: Campers will have fun preparing delicious, savory, and sweet recipes while learning skills such as kitchen organization and plating techniques with instructor Paula Costello and Assistant Anna Costello.

Gymnastics & Dance: Campers will develop and improve their strength, coordination, and flexibility while learning fun dance genres that will expose them to classical performing art skills! Campers will also learn basic acro and gymnastic skills with instructor Miss Courtney and assistant Lenka Gita throughout the week. This camp is designed to empower, educate, and release the performer within your future superstar!

Week 4: June 26-30

Creating with Clay: Work on a variety of arts and crafts projects with instructor Victor Kennedy, including animal sculptures, pendants, slab and pinch pot vessels, a wall relief piece, and a figurative O. I. (original character) "maquette" which is a clay sculpture of a story character drawing.

Flag Football: Campers will have fun while deepening their knowledge of flag football. This camp is for both beginner and intermediate players. Campers will learn the proper techniques for passing, running, kicking, and flag pulling, along with the rules and strategies of football.

Week 5: July 3, 5-7

Color Studio—Painting Using Pastels and Acrylics: Work on several paintings, including self-portraits, still-life compositions, and landscapes, with instructor Victor Kennedy.

Drama "FULL DAY CAMP": Campers will spend the week learning and developing basic theater skills as we work towards a final production to be performed on Friday.

Week 6: July 10-14

Creating Comic Pages: Create an original character, develop your original story and draw a series of comic pages with instructor Victor Kennedy.

Basketball: Learn or fine-tune your skills and basic game strategies of basketball with instructor Taylor Turnbow. We are developing the stars of tomorrow by building confidence through fun and fundamental teaching.

S.T.E.M.: Explore STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) in a week full of activities with instructor Sherrill Weihe and assistant Gordon Gita. Each day will consist of a different theme. Activities include astronomy, nature and biodiversity, outdoor survival skills, solar heat and cooking, nature tower building, STEM scavenger hunt, the water cycle in nature, exploding paint rockets, and scientific SLIME!

Hip Hop: Have fun with DANCE! This camp is for beginner or intermediate dancers. Learn techniques, choreography, and freestyle while preparing your camper for the next step in hip-hop dance. Instructor: Miss Courtney and assistant Lenka Gita

Week 7: July 17-21

Creating with Clay: Work on a variety of arts and crafts projects with instructor Victor Kennedy, including animal sculptures, necklace pendants, slab and pinch pot vessels, a wall relief piece, and a figurative O. I. (original character) "maquette" which is a clay sculpture of a story character drawing.

Gymnastics & Dance: Campers will develop and improve their strength, coordination, and flexibility while learning fun dance genres that will expose them to classical performing art skills! Campers will also learn basic acro and gymnastic skills with instructor Miss Courtney Reilly and assistant Lenka Gita throughout the week. This camp is designed to empower, educate, and release the performer within your future superstar!

All Sports *FULL DAY CAMP*: Shoot, run, jump, and hit your way into various sports for the week with instructor Taylor Turnbow and Kyle Roberts. Campers will learn the fundamentals or improve their knowledge in a different sport daily.

Week 8: July 24-28

Cooking: Enhance your creativity, literacy, math, science, and small motor skills through hands-on cooking activities! Young chefs will practice essential kitchen skills and master the fundamentals of cooking with instructor Paula Costello and assistant Anna Costello.

Art Studio: Work on various fun art projects, including drawing, painting, clay, and sculpture, with instructor Victor Kennedy.

Drama: Campers will spend the week learning and developing basic theater skills as we work towards a final production to be performed on Friday.

Soccer: Learn skills and tactics of the game of soccer in a fun and competitive way. Campers will develop individual skills through drills, fun competitions, and scrimmages. Instructor John Morris and assistant Gordon Gita.

Camp Facilities

All camp activities will be on the campus of Dunwoody Baptist Church. See the campus map. Specific areas include Children's Department and for Drama, Art, and Dance in DSA and Sports Center for all sports.

Camp Staff

Taylor Turnbow, Director of Camp Unite

Taylor grew up in Clarkston, Georgia, and graduated from Stephenson High School. She received a scholarship from LSU and played basketball there all four years. After graduating, she played overseas as a professional player. When she returned to the US, she began Coaching Junior College basketball. When looking for a church that offered water baptism, she found DBC and has been here ever since.

Lynn is the first point of contact with Camp Unite and is always here to assist parents either by phone, email or in person in the camp office.

Group Leaders

Our Certified Teachers, Instructors, and Coaches will lead our camps each week!

What to Bring / Wear

- ★ All children must wear tennis shoes.
- ★ Apply sunblock to your child before they arrive at camp each day.
- ★ Bring your child a labeled bottle of water each day.
- ★ Each child should bring their lunch and snack every day. Dress children in clothes that are okay to get messy. We will do our best to keep them neat, but we will not reimburse for clothes stained by our art projects or other activities.
- ★ Camper's backpacks will be kept in a secure area where only that camper will be allowed access.

Devotion Time

First and foremost, Camp Unite is a ministry of Dunwoody Baptist Church. Campers will participate in devotions each week. Content focuses on Christian behavior and is explored through lessons. We strive to make our content kid and family-friendly.

Group Participation Policy

To qualify for enrollment—and to remain enrolled—children in this program must be able to function in a group setting. We cannot change the emphasis on group activities we have at our camp. We will try to meet the needs of each child as long as it does not require a change in our camp format. Camp Unite is not a “special needs” camp. Our staff is not trained to work with special needs campers. If your child has special needs, please discuss with our head staff whether Camp Unite is the right camp for your child.

Visitors

If you, or someone authorized by you, need to be on campus during the day, you will only be able to come to the Camp Unite Office (*see map*). No one will be allowed to visit your child’s classroom for safety. Please communicate with the head staff and provide documentation if a biological parent is not allowed to pick up the child. Camper Release

Campers will be released only to people listed on your child’s registration that you have authorized to pick them up. If someone other than a parent is to pick up your child, please let us know in writing so we can add them to your list. We will ask them to show a picture ID. This helps to ensure your child’s safety. Please communicate with the head staff and provide proper documentation if a biological parent is not allowed to pick up the child.

Parent-Staff Relationship

Parents are responsible for keeping Camp Unite informed of any changes in enrollment information, including contact information or health information. Parents will receive weekly emails with important information concerning camp activities for that specific week. Please remember to check your email weekly. We value our camp families and look forward to building close relationships with you throughout the summer.

Emergency Transportation

In a medical emergency, your child may be transported to the nearest hospital (from Camp, this is Children's Healthcare of Atlanta) in a Dunwoody Baptist Church or possibly a private vehicle belonging to a camp staff member. Drivers of these vehicles have submitted their licenses and are insured by the church. An ambulance may be called to your child's location in more critical emergencies. In this case, your child will be transported to CHOA. In either case, you will be notified immediately. We will call your designated emergency contact person if we cannot reach you.

Illness/Injury Notification

In the event of your child's illness, we will contact you at the numbers you provide. In the event of an injury, we will provide first aid at camp. We will contact you for further instruction if the injury involves anything other than minor scrapes, cuts, or bruises. In a severe emergency, we will begin treatment and arrange for transportation to a hospital whether or not we can reach you. We will have a completed incident form for you to view for anything other than minor injuries or illnesses.

Exclusion of Sick/Contagious Children

Camp Unite requires children with an oral temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, along with any other possibly contagious symptoms (rash, cough, sore throat, vomiting, shortness of breath, muscle pain, new loss of taste or smell), to be sent home. Please do not send your child to camp if they exhibit any of these symptoms.

Illness

If your child has a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, they may not attend camp until they are free of fever without medication for 24 hours.

Personal Safety

Camp Unite will make every effort possible to ensure the safety of each camper. Each head staff member will be certified in First Aid and CPR.

Camper Rules

- ★ Campers are expected and encouraged to participate in all activities to the best of their ability and maintain a positive attitude.
- ★ No camper is to leave the supervision of their teacher or instructor.
- ★ Campers are not allowed to go into another person's clothing bag or lunch bag for any reason.
- ★ Foul language, profanity, or obscene gestures will not be permitted. Any such abuse will result in the calling of a child's parents to report the language used or a short session with the parent, child, and director at pickup time.
- ★ Name-calling that is abusive, belittling, or downgrading will not be tolerated and will result in the loss of certain privileges during camp time.
- ★ Physical violence will not be tolerated. Throwing rocks or foreign objects will not be permitted.
- ★ Any Camper who is constantly disruptive, non-cooperative, or fails to comply with the stated rules will lose their privileges of programmed activities.

Behavior Management

Camp Unite does reserve the right to dismiss any camper without a monetary refund if they seem unable to adjust to the group experience. If discipline is needed, our policy is that it will be carried out positively to enhance the campers' self-esteem and help develop self-control.

The individual need of each camper will be taken into consideration in determining discipline procedures. If and when problems persist, parents will be called for a conference with the Camp Director. Please know that corporal punishment will not be used for any reason.

We consider the process of camper discipline to be a partnership between the parents and our staff. We ask that parents would communicate to their children that the camp staff members are authority figures while they are at camp. In our experience, we've learned that when parents make this point in advance to their children, it aids in the prevention of discipline issues before they occur. We will strive to keep all parents informed about all but the most trivial infractions, and we rely heavily upon parents to follow up by disciplining the child at home when necessary.

Camp Unite operates with the sincere understanding that all children will likely commit some infraction from time to time because they are children.

We accept the responsibility to document such infractions and view any action taken on our part without proper documentation to be irresponsible and arbitrary. Nevertheless, habitual infractions that present a hazard to other campers or have the potential to create a breakdown in camp operation will be taken seriously and in a delicate manner. In such cases, this is not an act of judgment but a determination that Camp Unite may not be a good fit for the child. The criteria by which we must consider disallowing further admittance to Camp are as follows:

- ★ If the camper's actions present a hazard to other campers or significantly disrupt camp operations.
- ★ If a child habitually refuses to acknowledge the authority of camp staff.
- ★ If the parents of the child refuse to acknowledge a pattern of documented behavioral concerns or refuse to partner with camp staff in administering discipline. In addition, Camp Unite Directors reserve the right to make determinations regarding the seriousness of any infraction and the level of threat it presents to the camp as a whole. In a case where a camper has presented a hazard to the camp through their actions, camp management may disallow the camper from the premises after the first infraction. In all other cases, three such infractions are necessary before expulsion is considered, and consequences will be handled in the following order:
 - ★ The first time a child breaks a rule, they will be reminded that their behavior is inappropriate. It will be clearly stated that a warning has been given.
 - ★ The second time a child breaks a rule on the same day, the teacher will provide a consequence such as a 5-minute time-out period away from the group.
 - ★ The third time a child breaks a rule on the same day, a stricter consequence will be provided, such as being sent to the Camp Director for a time-out period and an opportunity for the Camp Director to speak with this child regarding their behavior.
 - ★ The fourth time a child breaks a rule on the same day, the Camp Director will call the child's parents to discuss the child's misbehavior.
 - ★ The parents will be asked to come and pick up their child immediately, and the child will not be allowed to return to camp that day but will be allowed to return to camp the following day. (Please know that a refund will not be given for such suspensions.)
 - ★ If the child's misbehavior persists the following day, the Camp Director will call the child's parents to come and pick up their child immediately, and the child will not be permitted to return to camp. (Please know that a refund will not be given for such expulsions.)

Severe Clause: In cases of severe misbehavior, such as fighting, vandalism, defying a teacher, or in some way stopping the whole group from functioning, a child will not receive a warning. They will lose the right to proceed through the hierarchy of consequences. The child will be sent directly to the Camp Director if such a case arises.

Campus Rules

Dunwoody Baptist Church is a non-smoking facility. Please refrain from smoking (Juuls included) while on the church campus and at all camp activities. Drinking alcohol is also prohibited on the church campus and at all camp activities. Illegal drugs are prohibited on the church campus and at all camp activities. Weapons and firearms are prohibited on the church campus and at all camp activities.

Child Welfare

Camp Unite has zero tolerance for abuse. All camp staff members are trained in child protection policies. We take these issues and policies very seriously. We are required by law to report when there is reasonable cause to believe that a child has been abused in any way, including physical abuse, emotional abuse, neglect, abandonment, and/or sexual abuse/exploitation.

Grievances

All grievances should be directed to the Camp Director. Usually, the problem can be solved through a personal conference. Appropriate records and documentation will be kept on matters relating to the grievances.

Right to Amend Policies

Camp Unite reserves the right to add and/or change policies for any family or camper when necessary due to individual circumstances and issues. This includes but is not limited to payment policies, late pick-up policies, and behavior management policies.
