Celebrant Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

MUSIC NOTES The choral music for this service is by the highly regarded Spanish Renaissance composer Tomás Luis de Victoria (1548-1611). Victoria wrote twenty different mass settings, which is a relatively small number for composers in his era. Many of his masses, including the Missa “O quam gloriosum” are “parody” masses, meaning that they are based on pre-existing works.

Victoria wrote his All Saints’ Day motet “O quam gloriosum” in 1572. It is a work of great “verve and drive,” relenting only briefly at the words “amicti stolis albis” (“clothed in white robes”). His mass setting based on this motet followed ten years later. The British musicologist Donald Tovey considered it one of the most perfect mass settings ever written.

Estonian composer Arvo Pärt (b. 1935) drew inspiration from a poem by Edmond Jabès when he wrote *Mein Weg hat Gipfel und Wellentäler* in 1989. The work’s title comes from the third verse of a poem from *The Book of Questions* (*Le Livre des questions*, 1963), a collection of French poems by Edmond Jabès that were also translated into German. Pärt is known for his unique, minimalist style (“tintinnabuli”) which he derived, in part, from the pure sounds of bells. In *Mein Weg*, the music consists of three separate lines, each moving at a different speed: eighth-note motion in the right hand, quarter note motion in the left hand, and half-note motion in the pedal. The lines duck and weave together, sometimes arriving and departing again from the same place (at their varying rates). One interpretation might be to hear the work as a depiction of daily life in dialogue with a longer, slower spiritual pilgrimage. And, for this All Saints’ Day service, the “road” in the poem could be understood through the words of the hymn (253) by Isaac Watts: “while the long cloud of witnesses / show the same path to heaven.”
