If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

#### THE NICENE CREED





MUSIC NOTES The Kyrie in this service comes from the earliest surviving piece of sacred choral music by English composer Herbert Howells (1892-1983), his Mass in the Dorian Mode (first known as the Missa Sine Nomine). Howells wrote this mass setting the same year he enrolled as a student at the Royal College of Music in London. At the urging of Howells's composition teacher, Charles Villiers Stanford, the work was premiered under the direction of Richard R. Terry at Westminster Cathedral. It was the first in what would be a series of neo-Tudor works that Howells would write for Terry and his choir.

English Tudor composer Orlando Gibbons (1583-1625) uses the first four verses of Psalm 6 in his full anthem "O Lord, in thy wrath." Gibbons, who died 400 years ago this year, also wrote madrigals, and there are elements of the customary "text painting" associated with that music in this anthem. One such instance occurs at the appearance of the words "For I am weak," which are sung to a dotted rhythm by the three upper voices of the six-voice texture.

The music sung at Communion by Thomas Tallis (1505-1585) may have begun life as early as the 1560s as an instrumental fantasia. It appears in the seminal collection *Cantiones sacrae*, published in 1575, to the Latin words "O sacrum convivium" (and it is this version that members of the choir will sing on Good Friday). The practice of re-texting Latin motets with English words, known as contrafactum, resulted in what is possibly the third version of this music by Tallis: the anthem "I call and cry to thee."


