The Second Lesson

Galatians 6:7-16

Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh; but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit. So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest-time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith. See what large letters I make when I am writing in my own hand! It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that try to compel you to be circumcised – only that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. Even the circumcised do not themselves obey the law, but they want you to be circumcised so that they may boast about your flesh. May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything; but a new creation is everything! As for those who will follow this rule – peace be upon them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God.

Luke 10:1-11, 16-20

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

The Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.'

"Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects the one who sent me."

The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" He said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

THE NICENE CREED

Lector Let us affirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the People

As God keeps watch over the nations, let us pray for the needs of the world, saying, "Let us be joyful in God; / May we glorify God's holy Name."

We pray for the Church, remembering Sean, Presiding Bishop; Deon, our Bishop; and for the clergy and ministry leaders of St. Peter's. May we be laborers in the harvest, proclaiming the nearness of the kingdom of God.

In our diocesan cycle we pray for St. Francis Episcopal Church in Eureka, and the Episcopal Church of All Saints and Ascension, our Companion Community. In the Anglican Communion, we pray for the Church of Nigeria. Let us be joyful in God;

- People May we glorify God's holy Name.
- Lector We pray for all nations and their leaders, remembering Donald, our President, and Mike, our Governor. May those in governance in this and every land fulfill the law of Christ, taking care not to sow to their own flesh, but knowing that at harvest time they will reap what they sow. We pray for the rejection of war and terror between nations, and the cultivation of mercy and peace, living and walking as new creations in Jesus Christ. Let us be joyful in God;
- People May we glorify God's holy Name.

Lector We pray for those with any need in this parish and community, especially for Mark Hoffmeister [and _____]. Whenever we have an opportunity, let us bring relief for those in poverty, illness, or in any pain, caring for the family of faith. Let us be joyful in God;

People May we glorify God's holy Name.

Lector We pray for the departed in God [especially for _____]. May peace and mercy be upon them, as we rejoice with them that their names are written in heaven. Let us be joyful in God;

People May we glorify God's holy Name.

Lector Let us pray for our own needs, and for those of others.

Silence is kept.

Celebrant O Lord, preserve your people. Hear our prayers and maintain righteousness everywhere. Grant that all things may take place in an orderly way, and peace may not be destroyed by revolution or secret enmity, nor the eternal good order be corrupted or debased by the offenses of others; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

CONFESSION OF SIN

Celebrant Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence is kept.

ORGAN VOLUNTARY

MUSIC NOTES It is often through the "pastoral services" of the church (weddings and funerals) that Episcopal clergy and church musicians, for better or worse, encounter hymnody popular in other Christian denominations. Such was the case with the Denver-born composer David Sinden (b. 1982) and the venerable Baptist hymn "Jesus paid it all" in 2016. It is also an example of how divisive "new" hymns can be: the priest conducting the funeral in question detested the words of the hymn; the organist, however, enjoyed getting to know the tune. Sinden's arrangement (perhaps originally conceived as a good-natured joke for the priest in question?) references the similarities between the tune, by John T. Grape, and the older hymn tune *Resignation* ("My shepherd will supply my need;" Hymn 664). It was recorded by the St. Peter's Choir for *Longing for Home* (Regent Records).

The words of the anonymous hymn "Sing, my soul, his wondrous love," have been included in the Episcopal Church's hymnody for almost two centuries. It was in an Episcopal hymnal from 1841 that American composer Ned Rorem (1923-2022) encountered these words and wrote this simple choral setting for them. In addition to this hymn, Rorem set several other hymns from this early hymnal to music. The hymn "Sing, my soul" also has a place in our current Hymnal 1982 at Hymn 467. Rorem won the Pulitzer Prize for Music in 1976.
